- Principles of Wilderness First Aid
- Rescue Planning
- Response & Assessment
- Soft Tissue Injuries & Medical Emergencies
- Spinal Cord Injuries & Management
- Sprains & Strains
- Trauma-Musculoskeletal Injuries
- Trauma-Soft Tissue Injuries
- Universal Precautions
- Use of Epinephrine

Check-in is at 7:30 on the first day of the course, Saturday, April 6, 2013. The course will run from 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. (16 hour course) on both days. The WFA course format is a combination of in-class lectures with outdoor practical scenarios. In case of inclement weather, the outdoor practical scenarios will take place in the Wyatt Gymnasium inside the Forest E. Wyatt Center.

REGISTRATION & CANCELLATION POLICIES

A \$100 non-refundable deposit is required to reserve your spot in the WFA course (preferably 30 days prior to the course date); there are only 24 spots available. Paid-in-full tuition is required 14 days prior to the course date, along with a signed copy of the registration form. Tuition is payable by cash, check, or money order. Equipment, course material, and instruction are included in the course cost; lodging and meals are not included. If paying by check or money order, make payment out to 'DSU OUTDOOR RECREATION.' If a student cancels or withdraws from the course greater than or equal to 30 days prior to the course starting date, Delta State University will retain the \$100.00 non-refundable deposit. If a student cancels or withdraws from a course less than 30 days prior to the course, Delta State University will retain all registration fees.

TRAVEL & DIRECTIONS

From Jackson, MS: •Travel along I-220 N/US-49 N. •Take exit 5B to merge onto US-49 N Yazoo City and continue to follow US-49 N. •Merge onto US-49W N toward Indianola and continue to follow US-49W N. •Turn right onto US-82 W (Indianola). •Turn right onto MS-448 W/N Sunflower Ave. •Turn left to stay on MS-448 W (by the Double Quick). •Take the 1st right onto US-278 E/US-61 N. •Turn left onto E Sunflower Rd/US- 8 W (DSU on the left).

From Southaven, MS: •Travel along I-55S to Jackson, MS. •Merge onto I-69S (Exit 283) toward Tunica, MS. •Continue onto MS-304W. •Turn left onto US-61S toward Tunica and continue to Cleveland, MS. •Turn right onto E Sunflower Rd./MS-8W (DSU on the left).

From Oxford, MS: •Travel MS-6 W/US-278 W. •Turn left onto US-278 W. •Merge left onto US-61S toward Greenwood. •Continue to follow US-61 S. •Turn right onto E Sunflower Rd/Hwy 8 W (DSU on the left).

From Starkville, MS: •Travel along US-82 W. •Turn right onto US-49E N. •Turn left onto MS-8W and continue to Cleveland, MS (DSU will be on the left).

Once on DSU campus: •Turn right onto Fifth Avenue (off of US-8W) and travel south. •Turn right onto Maple St and travel west. •Turn right onto Washington St. •HPER building will be on the right (#54 on the campus map).

LODGING & DINING

Lodging reservations and dining are the participant's responsibility. There are numerous hotels and dining options located near campus. Potential camping on DSU campus may be available.
