Employer Satisfaction Results

The state of Mississippi has a common survey for satisfaction of employers and completers. This was sent to all employers for the first time in 2016 statewide. The response rate was low for the first administration. In 2017, the state sent the survey to employers with teachers with one year of experience and to those with three years of experience, along with their employers. The response rate was better for the second year. The survey results below indicate the survey sent in the year 2019 for first (2018) and third (2016) year completers. Results were combined for 1st and 3rd year completers due to the low N. Measures are being taken to increase the response rate so that separate reports can be shared for 1st and 3rd year completers.
