She continued at Delta State Teachers College where she was head cheerleader, and graudated with a degree in English. From New Orleans, Ensign Sanders proceeded to Officer Candidate School and was promoted to Regimental Commander of the WAVES. Viola returned to Washington, D.C. as administrative officer to Admiral Richard E. Byrd as part of the International Geophysical Year. In her distinguished career, Captain Sanders was recipient of the United Nations Korean and National Defense Service medals and Legion of Merit Award. She was also honored at Arlington with a chair in the theater at the National Women in Military Service Memorial and was named to Who's Who of American Women. In 1966, Viola retired and returned to her roots in Sidon, took over management of the family farm Elder Grove, and began an active life in the Mississippi Delta. She served on the board of Delta State University, the board of Cottonlandia, and the Board of Trustees of Sidon Methodist Church. She was a member of American Legion Post 29 and enthusiastically worked on the Veteran's Monument Committee from concept to completion in 1999. Other recognitions were being named alumnus of the year by both Mississippi Delta Junior College and Delta State University. She was named Outstanding Citizen of Leflore County by the Lions Club, and named into the Greenwood Hall of Fame by the Chamber of Commerce. The Greenwood City Council honored

her with a street bearing her name. A highlight in her life, also, was being selected Grand Marshal of the 2007 Greenwood Christmas Parade.
