

## **iMBA Frequently Asked Questions**

**1. Do I need to take the GMAT to be admitted to the iMBA program?**

The GMAT is waived for applicants who meets the 1100 composite score requirement without the GMAT. (i.e., an applicant with at least a 3.0 grade point average and 5 years of managerial or professional work experience will meet the 1100 requirement without the GMAT). Students with at least a 1050 composite score are considered under provisional admission.

**3. Can I enroll in the iMBA program if I have a non-business related baccalaureate degree?**

Applicants, whose undergraduate degree is in an area other than business, may be considered for admission with the understanding that specific undergraduate course work is necessary to provide the basic knowledge for successful completion of the iMBA curriculum. These courses are taken prior to beginning Module I.

**4. What are the specific required courses?**

There are 30 hours of prerequisite courses to the iMBA program. These courses are as follows: Financial Accounting, Managerial Accounting, Microcomputer Applications, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Business Finance, Legal Environment of Business or Business Law, Management Principles, Marketing Principles, and Statistics. If you do not have these courses you may take the iMBA foundation courses.

**5. What are the iMBA Foundation Courses?**

The iMBA foundation courses includes: MBA 500 – Financial Accounting for Managers, MBA 505 – Productivity Software for Executives, MBA 520 – Theory of Economics, MBA 530 – Theory of Business Finance, MBA 540 – Statistics for Managers, MBA 550 – Theory of Management, MBA 560 – Theory of Marketing and MBA 570 – Legal Environment of Business.

**6. What type of financial assistance is available for iMBA students?**
