<u>Call to Order:</u> A regular meeting of the President's Cabinet was held in the President's Conference Room on August 17, 2015. The meeting convened at 1:30 p.m. with President LaForge presiding.

GENERAL OVERVIEW

- President LaForge welcomed Cabinet Members to the first meeting of the new school year. He also welcomed Mr. Mikel Sykes, Student Government President, back from his summer internship in Washington, DC.
- President LaForge announced the passing of Mr. Bill Moses, Administrative Assistant in Facilities
 Management, and asked the Cabinet for a moment of silence in his honor. The arrangements will be
 announced at a later date.
- President LaForge discussed e-mails he has received requesting a donation to the University Press in the amount of \$3,000 to support a book about Marie Hull's work. The decision was made to decline the request.
- President LaForge announced his thanks to the Cleveland-Bolivar County Chamber of Commerce for hosting the Welcome Back Reception for our faculty and staff. It was a great event, and he asked Cabinet Members to thank Chamber members when they see them around town.
- President LaForge discussed the Opening Session. He felt like it was a good event and was well attended. Everyone seemed to like the picture presentation of new employees. It was much quicker than having the new employees stand and for attendees to try and find them. He thanked Dr. Michelle Roberts for her work on the PowerPoint presentation. He stated that everyone seemed to appreciate the lunch, and he thanked our sponsor, Mr. Charlie McGuffee, for his support.
- President LaForge discussed Student Move-In Day. He thought everything went well and was well organized. Dr. Caston stated there weren't any issues with housing and the residence halls are pretty full. We have received positive comments about the new restrooms in Lawler-Harkins dorms. He thanked everyone for lending their support for this event. President LaForge also thanked Dr. Caston for his work on getting the Information Center in the Union up and running for move-in day. We had a lot of visitors to stop by and pick up information.
- President LaForge discussed this week's schedule. Day and night classes began this morning. He will
 speak to the Drew-Ruleville Rotary Club on Tuesday at North Sunflower Medical Center. He will teach
 a Leadership Class again this year, and it will begin on Tuesday. He will travel to Jackson on
 Wednesday for an Institutional Executive Officers meeting and the Institutions of Higher Learning

Board meeting on Thursday. He has a long list of items to discuss with IHL Commissioner Glenn Boyce. On Thursday evening he will attend a donor event at the Coahoma County Higher Education Center in Clarksdale where he will recognize Mr. Jon Levingston for his contributions. Also on Thursday evening, the Levitt-Amp Music Series will begin its weekly concert series in downtown Cleveland. Our Delta Music Institute (DMI) students are heavily involved with this project, and the DMI has received new equipment, which was donated by the Peavey's. On Friday, he will speak to the Cleveland Noon Lion's Club with Mr. Jeffrey Farris as his host.

• President LaForge asked Dr. Heslep to provide an enrollment update. After the first day of class we are down 129 students from this time last year. However, we typically register 100 students the first day of classes; so, hopefully that number will increase. She thinks we are in good shape.
