## Delta Down & Dirty Youth Obstacle and Challenge Run to Premier at 28th Annual Pig Pickin'.

Cleveland, Miss. – Delta State University's College of Education and Human Science's HPER Recreation Leadership program will host the first of a kind event for youth at the 28th Annual Pig Pickin' event on September 28th at Statesman Park. Inspired by adult runs like the Tough Mudder, Warrior Dash, and Spartan Race, the Delta Down and Dirty will allow 6-14 year old youth the opportunity to run an obstacle and challenge course located at Statesman Park. The nearly 1 Mile course will feature 25+ challenges and obstacles for youth to experience and confront.

A participant's age determines the distance the participant will run:

6-8 year olds = 1 Lap/1 Mile 9-11 year olds = 2 Laps/1.6 Miles 12-14 year olds = 3 Laps 2.4 Miles.

Onsite registration will be from 9-11am with the 6year old waves beginning at 11am – sharp! Participants will be given approximate race times at registration and will race in waves of 12-15 participant's at a time. Waves will roughly start every 5 minutes allowing participant's ample time to reach and attempt each obstacle without interference or overloads.

All obstacles and challenges are 'challenged by choice,' which means that participants will be encouraged and allowed to try the challenge/obstacle, but will not be required to complete them.

"This will be a fun, adventurous, and positive event; one that I hope will inspire youth to be active with their life, and give purpose for exercise and being fit," states Todd Davis, race director and developer. "I have participated in a number of 5Ks, triathlons, and other events including 2 full Ironman Triathlons, and there is no feeling like running through a finish line after a physical struggle. I want kids in our area to feel that same success and have an event of their own. I want kids to feel a sense of adventure, a bit of struggle, and then the emotional connection to finishing something physical, especially in front of their families, friends, and spectators – it's an awesome moment," Davis adds.

This event is a fundraiser for outdoor recreation opportunities in the Delta: 6-8 year olds =  $$20 \mid 9-11$  year olds =  $$25 \mid 12-14$  year olds = \$30.

All participants will receive a finisher T-Shirt and finisher medal. Course maps, training regiments, and registration information are located online at DSUOP.DELTASTATE.EDU.

In addition, the event is seeking obstacle sponsorships and needs nearly a 100 volunteers - \$150 for a small or partial obstacle and \$250 for a large or full obstacle. Volunteers can man safety stations, act as spotters at obstacles, help with obstacle construction and design, help with on-site registration, and assist at the start/finish line.
