

## **Intersession Q&A**

### **What classes can students take?**

During the Intersession, the Colleges of Arts & Sciences, Business, and Education will offer a broad range of classes including Accounting, Biology, Computer Information, Economics, Family Consumer Sciences, General Business, Geography, History, Marketing, Psychology, Social Work, Sociology and Special Education.

### **How long does it last?**

The intersession is scheduled for the period of one month. However, the exact length and beginning and ending dates of classes will vary based on delivery format.

### **What kind of fees apply-- is it regular fees?**

Intersession courses have a **separate fee** of \$669.00 for Undergraduate and \$891.00 for Graduate Courses for a 3 hour course during the 2011/2012 school year.

### **What are some of the advantages for students taking these classes?**

Three advantages to intersession classes:

- allows a student who may have had to drop a class to stay on track and graduate when originally planned
- lets a student get ahead of schedule and graduate early
- provides a time that is more convenient for some students

### **How many can they take?**

A student is only allowed to take up to 6 credit hours during Intersession.

### **What semester does the credit go to?**

Winter Intersession credits counts as Spring Term. Spring Intersession credits count as Summer I Term.

### **How does a student register for an Intersession class?**

A student should be able to register online for intersession courses, just as they do for Fall, Spring, and Summer courses. Registration for Intersession courses will begin the week of Pre-Registration. The last day to register for an Intersession course is at midnight after the first day of Intersession classes.
