Dual-Enrollment

What is Dual Enrollment?

- ◆ Dual Enrollment is a program under which high school students may earn college credit for specific course prior to graduation.

Why Dual Enrollment?

- ◆ The Program allows high school students to enroll in a course prior to high school graduation. College credits earned through dual enrollment can be simultaneously applied toward high school and college graduation and can be transferred to other colleges or universities. The program gives students first hand experience to the requirements of college-level work.

Where is a dual enrollment course taught?

- ◆ At an approved dual enrollment high school

What are the student requirements for dual enrollment?

- ◆ Application for dual enrollment at Delta State University
- ◆ Minimum ACT composite of 16
English, Math, and Reading sub score minimum 17
- ◆ Completed dual enrollment recommendation signed by the high school principal or guidance counselor and parents
- ◆ Payment of \$15 application fee and \$50 per course fee

What are the school requirements for dual enrollment?

- ◆ Employ an instructor with a master degree and 18 hours in their concentration area
- ◆ Adhere to guidelines set by DSU dual enrollment program
- ◆ Submission of syllabi, instructor transcripts and course selection form for approval of course before the stated deadlines.

What are the benefits of participating in dual enrollment?

- ◆ An increase in the number of education options
- ◆ Savings in time and money for post secondary courses
- ◆ Greater collaboration between high school and college faculty
- ◆ Basic understanding of what will be expected as college students
