Interesting Insights

The Summer Developmental Program (SDP) is an eight-week academic program designed for students who desire an alternate route to admission to a four-year university. At Delta State University, the SDP lasts from Monday, June 4, 2018, through Thursday, July 26, 2018. To allow students time to check into their residence halls, the first day will begin at 9:00 a.m. Monday, June 4, 2018. DSU operates on a four-day week (Monday – Thursday) throughout the summer. The normal class day begins promptly at 8:00 a.m. and extends until 3:35 p.m.

If you choose to live in a residence hall during the summer program, you will need to contact our Department of Housing and Residence Life. A \$75 non-refundable application fee is required prior to room assignment for the upcoming summer. Our housing staff, located in Union 202a, will be glad to help you with your request. Financial Aid

To apply for financial aid for the Summer Developmental Program, please complete each of the following steps immediately. Failure to complete the required forms promptly and accurately may result in a loss of financial aid.

To Apply for Financial Aid:

1. Complete the Delta State University Request for Federal Financial Aid –Summer 2018. This form is available online. Go to www.deltastate.edu/finaid, then choose forms, the summer application is at the top of the page. You do not have to attach a printed copy of your summer schedule to this application.

2. Complete the 2017-2018 FAFSA online at www.fafsa.ed.gov using the information from your 2016 tax return. This will determine the amount of your Pell Grant award for the summer.

3. Complete the Delta State University Supplemental Awarding Information form for both the 2017-2018 award year and the 2018-2019 award year. This form can be found online. Visit www.deltastate.edu/finaid, choose forms, click on 2017-2018, and print out the DSU form, then click on 2018-2019, and print out the DSU form.

4. Complete the 2018-2019 FAFSA online at www.fafsa.ed.gov using the information from your 2017 tax return. This will determine the amount of your Pell Grant award for the fall and spring terms.

5. Summer Developmental Program students are only eligible to receive Pell Grants. Pell Grants will not cover all expenses, and some expenses will have to be paid out of pocket. Please be aware that Student Business Services will expect payment in full by May 29, 2018.
