Hamilton Child Development Scholarship

- Given by Mr. Albert G. Hamilton in honor of his parents, A.G. and Velma Shelton Hamilton
- Awarded to a student majoring in Family & Consumer Sciences with a concentration in Child Development
- Two scholarships up to \$600 each are awarded each year
- Two recipients will receive up to \$300 for fall and spring semester
- Recipients are selected by a committee

Requirements: Freshman or a current student with a Concentration in Child Development Maintain a GPA of 2.5(C+) or greater Show active participation in FCS activities and clubs

McQuagge Child Development Scholarship

- Given by Mrs. Atwell McQuagge in honor of her husband, Dr. Carl McQuagge.
- Awarded annually to a Mississippi resident majoring in Family & Consumer Sciences with a concentration in Child Development
- May be awarded to one or two students
- If two students receive the scholarship, each will receive up to \$250 per semester.
- If only one student is named, up to \$500 will be given at the beginning of both the fall and spring semesters for a total up to \$1000 per year
- Recipients will be selected by committee

Requirements: Resident of Mississippi freshman or a current student with a concentration in Child Development, maintain a GPA of 2.5 (C+) or greater, have good moral character and show active participation in FCS activities and clubs.

Student Association of Family & Consumer Sciences Scholarship

- Established to allow growth and promotion of the program
- Allows professional growth
- Awarded to an active member of SAFCS
- The application should be completed and returned to the Division by January of each year

Requirements: SAFCS/MAFCS member of AAFCS Family & Consumer Sciences Major Sophomore or Junior in good standing with a 2.5 overall GPA/3.0 GPA in FCS Attendance and participation at local, state, and national conferences Professional attitude
