### Selected Reference Books

#### *General*

- 📖 **Encyclopedia of Family Life** [HQ534 .E53 1999 Ref, 5 volumes] – over 400 entries on all aspects of families in the United States and Canada, from “Abandonment of the Family” to “Zero Population Growth Movement.” Each entry ranges from 1 to 10 pages in length and is accompanied by several black and white photographs.
- 📖 **International Encyclopedia of Marriage and Family** [HQ9 .E52 2003 Ref, 4 volumes] – over 300 entries related to marriage and family life across the world on topics from “Abortion” to “Zambia.”

#### *Child Development*

- 📖 **Encyclopedia of Human Development** [HM626 .E53 2006 Ref] – Contains ~650 entries with overviews and explanations of the major topics in human development.
- 📖 **Encyclopedia of Parenting Theory & Research** [HQ755.8 .E523 1999 Ref] – 244 signed entries on all aspects of parenting. Each entry ranges from 1 to 2 pages in length and includes references.
- 📖 **Gale Encyclopedia of Childhood & Adolescence** [HQ772 .G27 1998 Ref] – 1 to 4 page entries covering all aspects of child development.
- 📖 **Thesaurus of ERIC Descriptors** [Ready Reference Z695.1 .E3 T49 2001 Ref] – a list of controlled vocabulary (subject headings) used to describe and index articles, books, reports, etc. contained in the ERIC (Educational Resources Information Center).

#### *Clothing, Textiles & Fashion Merchandising*

- 📖 **All About Cotton: A Fabric Dictionary & Swatchbook** [TS1582 .P37 1998 Ref] – offers 40 swatch samples and detailed descriptions of cotton fabrics, fiber properties, finishes, and care instructions.
- 📖 **All About Silk: A Fabric Dictionary & Swatchbook** [TS1665 .P37 1992 Ref] – provides 32 swatch samples of silk and describes its types, characteristics, and special effects. Care instructions and a glossary are also included.
- 📖 **All About Wool: A Fabric Dictionary & Swatchbook** [TS1625 .P37 1996 Ref] – everything you need to know about wool. Offers detailed descriptions and 35 swatch samples, plus a glossary of terms.
- 📖 **Contemporary Fashion** [TT505.A1 C66 2002 Ref] – over 350 entries on fashion designers or fashion houses since 1945. Each entry has a brief biography, a bibliography and a signed encyclopedic entry, accompanied by black and white photographs.
- 📖 **Encyclopedia of Clothing and Fashion** [GT507 .E53 2005 Ref, 3 vols.] – contains 640 essays on specific topics related to clothing and fashion. Most entries include cross-references and source bibliographies.
- 📖 **Greenwood Encyclopedia of Clothing Through World History** [GT507 .G74 2008 Ref 3 vols.] – traces the evolution of clothing throughout world cultures from prehistory to the present.

- 📖 **Greenwood Encyclopedia of Daily Life** [GT31 .G74 2004 Ref 6 vols.] - contains a wealth of material on the domestic, economic, intellectual, material, political, recreational, and religious life of people worldwide from ancient times through the modern era.
- 📖 **Historical Dictionary of the Fashion Industry** [TT494 .S84 2008 Ref] – a reference for fashion and the industries and professionals who create it. Includes a chronology and appendices for fashion magazines, trade associations, museums and top fashion schools among others.
- 📖 **Real Resumes for Retailing, Modeling, Fashion & Beauty Jobs** [HF5383 .R3959 2002 Ref] – gives advice for finding a job and provides 80 examples of actual resumes

### *Food & Nutrition*

- 📖 **Bowes & Church's Food Values of Portions Commonly Used** [TX551 .P385 2005 Ref] – provides authoritative data on the nutritional value of foods in a quick and easy reference. Also includes many Supplemental Tables for other substances i.e., caffeine, dietary fiber, and vitamins. Additionally, it provides a cross-reference for the common name of plants and the scientific name.
- 📖 **CRC Desk Reference for Nutrition** [QP141 .B523 2006 Ref] – a comprehensive reference for medical, food science, metabolic, physiologic, drug and nutrition terms. Also covered are drugs used to manage nutrition-related conditions. Two appendices contain information about meal planning and food selection, and a variety of metabolic maps.
- 📖 **Encyclopedia of Foods: A Guide to Healthy Nutrition** [TX 349 .E475 2002 Ref] – contains nutritional information, descriptions of food, and meal plans.
- 📖 **Encyclopedia of Human Nutrition** [QP141 .E526 2005 Ref, 4 volumes] – signed entries on all aspects of nutrition, ranging from 3 to 10 pages in length, accompanied by suggestions for further reading.
- 📖 **Encyclopedia of Vitamins, Minerals, and Supplements** [QP771 .E53 2004 Ref] – a plain language reference on vitamins, minerals and food substances. Also includes eleven appendices with information on the Food Pyramid, government acts and reports related to improving the nation's health, i.e. *Healthy People 2010*.
- 📖 **Food Safety Sourcebook** [TX531 .F5685 1999 Ref] – basic consumer health information about the safe handling of meat, poultry, seafood, eggs, fruit juices, and other food items. Also contains facts about pesticides, drinking water, food safety overseas, and the onset, duration, and symptoms of food-borne illnesses.
- 📖 **Healthy People 2010: Understanding and Improving Health** [RA445 .U486 2001 Ref] – The U.S. Government's initiative for a healthier citizenry. Provides statistics, as well as guidelines for improving the health status of Americans.

- 📖 **MasterFile Premier** [EBSCOhost] <sup>Off-Campus Full-Text</sup> – covers all disciplines, with more general-interest magazines than journals.

#### *Child Development*

- 📖 **ERIC Educational Resource Information Center** (1966-present) [EBSCOhost] <sup>Off-Campus Full-Text</sup> – database for education composed of CIJE (Current Index to Journals in Education) & RIE (Resources in Education).

#### *Food & Nutrition*

- 📖 **AGRICOLA** [EBSCOhost] <sup>Off-Campus Full-Text</sup> Compiled by the U.S. National Agricultural Library (NAL), this comprehensive source of bibliographic information consists of over 4.3 million citations to journal articles, monographs, theses, patents, software, audio-visual materials, and technical reports. The records describe publications and resources encompassing all aspects of agriculture and allied disciplines including food and nutrition.
- 📖 **CINAHL with Full Text** [EBSCOhost] <sup>Off-Campus Full-Text</sup> – includes 62 journals on nutrition and nutrition education
- 📖 **Health Source: Nursing/Academic Text** [EBSCOhost] <sup>Off-Campus Full-Text</sup> – includes 45 journals on nutrition.
- 📖 **MEDLINE** (1966-present) [EBSCOhost] <sup>Off-Campus</sup> – covers all aspects of medicine, as well as microbiology, nutrition, pharmacology, and environmental health.

- ⌘ **Food & Nutrition Information Center** [ <http://www.nal.usda.gov/fnic/> ] – dietary guides, selected Web sites, articles, and publications prepared by the Food and Nutrition Information Center. Compiled by the USDA Food and Nutrition Information Center and the University of Maryland Department of Nutrition and Food Science.
- ⌘ **Center for Nutrition Policy and Promotion** [ <http://www.cnpp.usda.gov/> ] – contains dietary guidelines for Americans, MyPyramid food guidance system, healthy eating index, U.S. food plans, nutrient content of the U.S. food supply, and expenditures on children by families.
- ⌘ **MedlinePlus** [ <http://MedlinePlus.gov> ] - Medical information aimed at consumers provided in both English and Spanish
