

Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund-Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

Monthly Report as of September 23, 2020

Fund Acknowledgment: On, April 13, 2020, Delta State University signed and returned the Recipient's Funding Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. DSU intends to use no less than 50 percent of the funds received under section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Total Funding: Delta State University received \$1,262,219.00 in Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) – Student Aid.

Funding Disbursed: As of September 23, 2020, \$320,625 has been awarded to students.

Eligible Participants: For spring 2020, approximately 1,461 DSU students are eligible for Title IV aid.* For fall 2020, approximately, 1,531 DSU students are eligible for Title IV aid.

Total Recipients: As of September 23, 2020, 505 students have received Emergency Financial Aid.

Methodology: Students were required to complete a Free Application for Federal student Aid (FAFSA) to verify eligibility requirements are met under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended (HEA). The maximum Federal Pell grant for the 2019-20 academic year is being used as the maximum award threshold per student subject to tiered estimated family contribution levels and cost of attendance maximums by category for the applicable academic term.
