Faculty are should not required to schedule synchronous class meetings during every designated class time; and synchronous meetings should not comprise more than seventy-five percent of designated class times. however, Students registering for the course are expected to be prepared to meet during every scheduled class time. Faculty provide and maintain a schedule in the University's learning management system of all synchronous activities. This mode of instruction is not intended for use in a fully-online program.
