# Authority

The Delta State University Police Department's (UPD) mission is to protect the lives and property of our students, employees, guests and the university itself.

Our goals are to understand & serve the needs of the campus community and to improve the quality of life by building capacities to maintain order, resolve problems & apprehend criminals in a manner consistent with statutes and accredited policies.

The University Police Department includes the following sections: Police Patrol & Investigation, Emergency Management, Special (Event) Operations and Parking Services.

University Police Officers are armed, have arrest powers & authority on all property owned, leased or governed by the MS IHL.

Police officers are required to meet the criteria established by the MS Board on Law Enforcement Officers Standards & Training and attend a law enforcement basic training academy. Officers also maintain 24hrs annual training as prescribed in BOLEST standards by regularly attending advanced and in-service training programs as a part of this mandatory continuing education. University officers are on duty 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, including holidays.

Police officer functions include but are not restricted to the following:

- Vehicle, foot, cart and bike patrol of the campus community.
- Emergency response to reports of a crime in progress on or adjacent to university property.
- Investigating criminal offenses committed on university property.
- Assisting other local, state & federal law enforcement agencies with business on campus.
- Providing motorist assistance, unlocking vehicles, providing vehicle boosts & safety escorts on campus as requested.
- Enforcing state statutes & university regulations (ordinances).
- Educating the DSU Family on keeping themselves as well as their property safe.

PROTECT YOUR VALUABLES AND YOURSELF:

- Never leave a vehicle or your residence unlocked; it only takes seconds for a theft to occur.
- Don't leave valuables visible in your car. If you must leave them, place them in the trunk.
- NEVER leave your phone, laptop or device unsecured or unattended.
- Don't give out personal information to anyone. Banks and other entries will not ask you for personal information.

Every employee and student who parks on campus at any time is required to register his/her vehicle and purchase a permit (decal).

To register you must have the following: a valid driver's license; your license plate number; the make, model, year and color of your vehicle.

#### PUT DOWN YOUR PHONE WHILE OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE!

## Any driver's #1 priority is the safe operation of his/her vehicle.

- Never dial the phone while driving. Dial while the car is not in motion, such as at a traffic light.
- Keep calls brief; stay focused on the road.
- Learn about the features on your phone, such as driving mode and auto reply.
- No call is worth your or someone else's life.
- Let a passenger answer the phone, relay information or take a message.
