1. Action Item	 Vote of No Confidence – Dean Ellen Green 2nd Reading CJ received anonymous email w/ comments re: Dr. Green's performance as dean. DM – would feel more specific actions that are under consideration. ZT – comments re: growth cannot be necessarily pinned to the dean; more specificity needed. CJ shared those concerns; just wanted to share, as it was received today. CJ had conversation w/ Erik Richards, who asked that it be included in today's meeting. Erik Richards is suing the University re: being placed on administrative leave. Why this matters: If the dean had followed policy, the oral reprimand and process would be followed. The policy was not followed, which is the reason for the litigation. The University will be sued w/ the possibility of a settlement which falls into the dean's portfolio. Pending litigation is in process. Spoke with President after ULC and advised him of Faculty Senate's actions, including climate of fear, etc., among faculty. In the past, the opportunity to express concerns over leadership was limited w/ little to no recourse. IHL is on notice r/t removal of university presidents. He asked that I keep him posted and acknowledged the fact that the Faculty Senate operates on its own. The former provost wanted to attend all FS meetings, but there was no reason for his attendance by default. Dr. Ennis acknowledges this fact. Meeting with MS FS Presidents this week; member from JSU reiterated their trials due to no president at this time. As a result, some difficulties with administration have arisen. Vote of no confidence in president and provost have been issued r/t: hostile work environment and practices and problems with

 accreditation. The Faculty Senate has taken a stand, but they are acting on behalf of JSU faculty. Any history of lawsuits against DSU? MEW – archives of votes of no confidence, and there has not been one for the last 10-15 years, but several prior to that time. PD – seems like a major step; is there a precedent? Yes, per CJ. 		
 4. Letter of Concern vs Vote of No Confidence NT – not well versed in proper procedure; CJ – we can move forward either way; ZT – are there best practices? Does letter of concern go first and then vote of no confidence? CJ – we will discuss it, but not necessarily. MEW – we do not have to first issue a vote of concern before we issue a vote of no confidence; those two tend to stay where they are. 		
DM – binary vote; if it were the letter of no concern; it certainly could move to no confidence vote. At conclusion of current lawsuit could display even more of a pattern that could strengthen the claims. CJ – Do we need a pattern? Waiting for future actions does not change past actions.		
SK – Comfortable to make a motion for vote of no confidence and move to that step.	Motion SK	Motion passed
