# Minutes

<u>Call to Order</u>: A regular meeting of the President's Cabinet was held in the President's Conference Room on November 11, 2019. The meeting convened at 2:00 p.m. with President LaForge presiding.

## **APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES**

On motion by Mr. Rutledge and seconded by Mr. Munroe, all Cabinet Members present and participating voted unanimously to approve the Minutes of the Cabinet Meeting held on November 4, 2019.

#### **GENERAL OVERVIEW**

- President LaForge announced former Delta State employee, Ms. Missy Pearce passed away last week and her funeral was today. Also, Delta State student, Mr. Drew Rexrode passed away last week and his funeral services are today.
- Mr. James Forte, Director of the Annual Fund, provided Cabinet members with an overview of University Advancement's phone-a-thon. The university hasn't conducted a phone-a-thon in over 15 years. Mr. Forte's main goals for the phone-a-thon were to increase alumni giving, engage alumni, and allow Delta State students to network with alumni. At the beginning of the phone-a-thon, 19,000 alumni were on the call list; however, 10,000 numbers were incorrect or disconnected. The phone-athon callers had 9,000 conversations in six weeks and raised \$35,000 in gifts and pledges. Two student callers, Mr. Stephen Turner and Ms. Phiandrea Pruitt shared their experiences with speaking to alumni during the phone-a-thon.
- President LaForge gave an overview of the activities and events from the past week. Northwest Mississippi Community College's Phi Theta Kappa invited President LaForge to be the keynote speaker at their induction ceremony. The Gulf South Conference Executive Committee held a conference call to discuss ineligible players. Dr. McAdams and other members of the academy met with Dr. Otha Belcher to discuss partnership opportunities. Dr. McAdams and Dr. Belcher are going to work with the planetarium, the Digital Media Arts Center, and the Student Success Center to schedule a tour of campus for Cleveland School District counselors, staff, and principals. President LaForge hosted

another Faculty and Staff Luncheon, and he welcomed guests to the Mississippi Association of School Business Administrators Leadership Conference held on campus. Mr. Munroe gave an overview of the National Alumni Association Board meeting. He stated the meeting had good attendance and a lively discussion culminating in the Board wanting to be more involved with the university. Dr. Bennett and Mr. Munroe gave an overview of Homecoming activities.

- Mr. Rutledge gave an update on Facilities Management projects. The HVAC system for Walter Sillers Coliseum wasn't ready last weekend for the basketball tournament, but it will be installed by the end of day. Damage occurred in several classrooms of Holcombe-Norwood Hall and Fielding Wright Art Center due to the contractor not properly sealing off the work area from the rain. The damage will be repaired by the contractor. Bailey Hall renovations will be complete by Thanksgiving to allow Student Success Center to move in during the Christmas Holidays. Materials for the roofing project on the Hugh Smith Facilities Management building were delivered and work should begin next week. Delta State and the contractor for the Ronald Mayers Aquatics Center HVAC project differ on several items, so a meeting has been called to discuss the plans going forward. Entergy cut off their grants until January, so Facilities Management is preparing a plan for new lighting projectors for the new year. The windows for the President's home are installed, and doors will go in this week to allow the contractor to work on the interior during the winter. The Golf Course Feasibility Student Engagement letter was signed by IHL and Dixon Hughes, LLP. Mr. Rutledge hopes to have the results of the feasibility study from Dixon Hughes, LLP by February.
- Mr. Kinnison gave an update on Athletics. Athletics had a great Homecoming weekend. Over 70 women's basketball alumni and their families returned to campus for a reunion. The women's basketball team hosted the GSC/SSC Crossover, and they won both of their games. The men's basketball team went 1-2 at the GSC/SSC Crossover. Both teams compete away this weekend. The men and women's soccer teams played their last game of the season at Spring Hill College on Saturday. The men lost, but the women won advancing them to the Gulf South Conference Tournament Tuesday at Mississippi College. The football team beat University of West Georgia on Saturday and will compete against Mississippi College for their last regular season game this weekend. The swimming and diving teams had a clean sweep at Henderson State University on Friday. The Coaches Radio Show takes place tonight at No Way Jose.
- President LaForge shared with Cabinet Members some of the meetings and events planned for the week. Statesmen Spotlight Day occurred today. Dr. Bennett shared approximately 1,350 students guests were on campus for the event, and she thrilled with the participation and attendance. The Bologna Performing Arts Center performance of Tedeschi Trucks Band is tonight. President LaForge will host his fifth Faculty and Staff luncheon on Tuesday, and the Colloquia Lecture Series featuring Governor Haley Barbour and Mr. Jere Nash begins at 6:00 p.m. in Jobe Hall Tuesday evening. President LaForge asked for Cabinet members' help in spreading the word. The Cleveland Music Foundation Board meets Thursday, and the College of Business and Aviation hosts a Scholarship Program on Thursday, as well. President LaForge will visit the Art Department on Friday, and he will travel to Clinton on Saturday to attend the Delta State vs. Mississippi College football game.

Currently, they are working on a Martin Luther King Day program featuring Mr. Jesse Holland.

The International Admissions Specialist position will be funded through international student fees. The Student Support Specialist position is currently filled; however, the position will be vacated on November 18.
