Call to Order: The meeting of the Ad Hoc Committee on Budget Sustainability was held in the Janice Wyatt Conference Room on February 20th. The meeting convened at 3:04 p.m. with Ms. Carolyn Bailey giving the welcome.

Approval of the Minutes

Upon review of the February 13th minutes, Dr. Jon Westfall made the motion to accept the minutes. Dr. Nora Gough Davis seconded the motion. The motion went forward unopposed.

General Overview

- IHL approved the Retirement Incentive plan.
- In the zero-based budget training, the Vice Presidents were encouraged to save 5%.
- The committee discussed using data driven course planning.
- Dr. Jon Westfall made the motion to present the recommendation to the President. Mr. David Gladden seconded the motion.
- “The committee recommends that course programming be planned using data. Specifically, program coordinators should develop a course rotation document that lists all courses in their program, when that course is normally offered, and any special considerations for each course (e.g., service commitments, requirements for other programs or minors. Further, program coordinators should work with OIT to develop an ARGOS Student-Course Matrix Report, which shows all students in the program and which courses they have taken, allowing coordinators to justify offerings by estimating the number of majors needing the course. Examples of this report are provided.”
- The recommendation went forward unopposed.

- Dr. Heather Miller made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Ms. Kristen Land seconded the motion. The motion went forward unopposed.
- Meeting adjourned at 5:10 p.m.

Data Driven Course Planning

1. Each program should have a course rotation document, which outlines a course rotation consistent with their program degree requirements and service commitments.
2. Each program should have access to an ARGOS report showing their current majors and courses that major has taken.
3. Each program coordinator should prepare a tentative schedule for the next semester using #1 and #2, allowing them to present an argument for each course on the planned schedule.
 - a. This protects the students ability to matriculate by showing a need for specific courses.
 - b. This protects the primacy of faculty decisions in curriculum by showing the evidence for their recommendations to administration.
 - c. This protects the administration by allowing for a clear understanding of why decisions were made in the way they were.
