

#### COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER - BILLY NOWELL



Billy Nowell was born and raised in Cleveland, MS. He graduated from Delta State University in 1972 with a Bachelor of Arts in Business. During his time at Delta State University, he served as Vice President of the Student Government Association and President of his fraternity. Throughout the years, Nowell continues to serve his alma mater as a member of the Delta State University Foundation Board of Directors and Alumni Association Board of Directors as well as the Booster Club for Statesmen Athletics. In 2009, Nowell was named Alumnus of the Year.

His rewarding career includes a few years in the banking business before joining his father in the family

lumber business, Nowell Lumber Company, where he served as Vice President. After selling the family business, Nowell ventured into the quick lube oil change business and is currently co-owner and manager/broker for Partnership Properties Real Estate Company.

Nowell served as City Alderman for eight years from 2001-2009, and he is currently serving his fourth term as Mayor of Cleveland. During his tenure as Mayor, he has focused on working collaboratively to build partnerships with key stakeholders and the citizens of Cleveland. Under his leadership, the City of Cleveland has worked closely with the Cleveland-Bolivar County Chamber of Commerce to promote economic growth and continue to build a vibrant business community. Nowell has worked hard to ensure that Cleveland is safe, clean, and great place to live with a high quality of life for its citizens. One of his proudest accomplishments during his tenure is helping facilitate Cleveland becoming the home to GRAMMY Museum® Mississippi in 2016. Throughout his time as a government official, Nowell has served on the Delta Mayors Council, Mississippi Municipal Services Board of Directors, and the Mississippi Municipal League. Currently, he serves as the President of the Mississippi Municipal League.

He generously gives of his time to serve Cleveland and Mississippi through involvement in many organizations including the South Delta Planning and Development District Board of Directors, the Cleveland-Bolivar County Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors, the Cleveland-Bolivar County Economic Development Foundation, Delta Council, Crosstie Arts Council, Bolivar County Community Action Agency, and the Cleveland Rotary Club. He has been nominated as a Paul Harris Fellow by the Rotary Club of Cleveland, awarded the Kossman Award for Community Service by the Cleveland-Bolivar County Chamber of Commerce, awarded Keep Mississippi Beautiful Mayor of the Year in 2015, and was named the Cleveland Junior Auxiliary Charity Ball King in 2013.

Nowell and his wife, Becky, have two children and four wonderful grandchildren. They are active members of the First United Methodist Church in Cleveland.

#### **Honorary Degree**

Honorary doctoral degrees have been a tradition in North American higher education for more than 300 years. These degrees are conferred *honoris causa* ("for the sake of honor"). An honorary degree serves to recognize both the grantee and the spirit of the granting institution.

Delta State University confers the honorary degree to individuals who have made significant and meritorious contributions to the university, higher education generally, or other areas of society. Achievements can include, but are not limited to, outstanding creative and scholarly work, distinguished leadership or service, significant accomplishments, and exceptional philanthropic support.



#### David R. Bowen

David R. Bowen is a former U. S. Congressman from Mississippi's second district. He was born in Houston, MS, and he grew up in Cleveland, MS, and was a graduate of Cleveland High School. Bowen received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Harvard University, and he received his Master of Arts degree with a focus on politics, economics, and philosophy from the University of Oxford. Prior to his election to Congress, Bowen taught history and political science at Millsaps College, served as Southeastern Coordinator for the Office of Economic Opportunity, was a staff associate for the United States Chamber of Commerce, and was the first Federal-State Programs Coordinator for Mississippi.

During Bowen's five terms as a U.S. Congressman, he established himself as a leader in agricultural, foreign policy affairs, and maritime issues. He served as a ranking member of the House Agriculture Committee, where he chaired the Subcommittee on Cotton, Rice, and Sugar. He also served on the House Foreign Affairs Committee, and on the Committee on Merchant Marine and Fisheries. On the latter committee, he was active in legislative affairs affecting the maritime and shipping industry, fishing and wildlife, and regulations of inland and coastal waterways. His foreign affairs activities included serving on the Asian and Pacific Affairs Subcommittee and representing the House and the nation in numerous international meetings, negotiations, and debates.

Upon completion of his time in office, Bowen was the Executive Director of the Council for National Interest, and he turned his attention to teaching, creative writing, photography, writing political commentary for newspapers, and preserving history through the Mississippi Historical Society. He was a visiting political science professor at Mississippi State University, and he wrote and produced three plays.

Bowen was recognized in April 2015 for his service to the Second District of Mississippi with a historical marker in Cleveland, MS. In March 2022, Bowen served as the guest lecturer for Delta State's Colloquia: Distinguished Speakers Lecture Series. He has been a staunch supporter of higher education, and he recognizes its vital role in shaping the future workforce and driving economic prosperity.

#### Wheeler Parker, Jr.



Wheeler Parker, Jr. is a native of Schlater, MS, and he is the first child born to Hallie and Wheeler Parker. He graduated from Moler Barber College and devoted 55 years to being a barber. He attended Moraine Valley Community College, C. H. Mason Theological Seminary, Global University, the Art Institute of Chicago, and he graduated from the School of Modern Photography. He served as a Medical Specialist in the United States Army for two years, and he was ordained as a minister in 1978. Parker was appointed as Argo Temple Church of God in Christ's Pastor in 1993, appointed District Superintendent of Glad Tidings District in 2018, and appointed Administrative Assistant to the Bishop of the 5th Jurisdiction of Illinois in 2024.

Parker is a cousin to Emmett Till and the last living eyewitness to the events surrounding Till's tragic demise. He is a sought-after public speaker who has dedicated his life to preserving and sharing the history and struggle for equal justice in the United States. Reverend Parker offers a firsthand account of one of the United States' most infamous murders and a message of hope and resilience in the ongoing fight for equality through his memoir, "A Few Days Full of Trouble." When the U. S. Justice Department reopened the Till case in 2004 and again in 2018, he served as a witness and spokesman for the Till family. In February 2022, Parker was a guest of President Joe Biden for the signing of the Emmett Till Anti Lynching Act, and he accepted the Congressional Gold Medal on behalf of Emmett Till and his mother, Mamie Till-Mobley. On July 25, 2023, he was honored to introduce President Joe Biden at the signing of the proclamation which created the Emmett Till and Mamie Till Mobley National Park.

Reverend Parker has generously given of his time to participate in events sponsored by Delta State University. He participated in panel discussions as part of the Delta Center for Culture and Learning's *The Most Southern Place on Earth* workshop sponsored by the National Endowment for the Humanities. He has spoken at Delta State University on several occasions, and he collaborated with the University Archivist to create a traveling exhibit, *Emmett Till: An Exhibit*, which has educated audiences across the country.

Reverend Parker is married to Dr. Marvel McCain, and they are community activists and proponents for justice. They do missionary work in Central America, and they are currently building a church in Belmopan, Belize.

- Out of courtesy and respect of graduating students and speakers, please remain in your seat during the ceremony. This will allow the ceremony to flow smoothly and reduce distractions and disturbances to other audience members.
- At the conclusion of the ceremony, please remain at your seat until all faculty and students have exited the auditorium.

Delta State University is proud of our student's accomplishments and success. We appreciate your cooperation celebrating a major milestone in students and their family's lives. We want everyone to share and enjoy a memorable and dignified Commencement ceremony.

#### SIGNIFICANCE OF ACADEMIC REGALIA FOR

#### **COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES**

Since the Middle Ages, a time-honored tradition of great dignity has been the wearing of academic apparel, which was a survival of still earlier civilian fashions. The academic gown, necessary for a scholar's warmth, and the hood to protect his tonsured head were apparently first regularly adopted in the thirteenth century at the University of Cambridge (1284). The University of Oxford was soon to follow. The custom was transplanted to this country in colonial times by King's College in New York, now Columbia University.

In 1895 American universities and colleges decided to standardize their academic styles and developed the intercollegiate code of academic costume, following primarily the Cambridge tradition. The characteristic elements of academic regalia are three: gown, cap, and hood.

The *gown* is usually of black material (serge or worsted for bachelors, the same or silk for masters, and silk for doctors). The doctors' dress gowns of the chief British universities are scarlet. Bachelors' gowns have pointed sleeves; masters' have long, closed sleeves, with lunettes at the bottom and slits at the elbows from which the arms protrude; and doctors' have wide, round, open sleeves. Doctors' gowns are faced with panels of velvet down the front and three bars of velvet across each sleeve.

The *cap*, the square mortar-board in American universities but a round, soft, flat, velvet hat in British, Canadian, and some European universities, bears a tassel that may be black for all ranks and degrees, or may be of gold thread or the color of the degree for doctors and the color of the degree for bachelors and masters. The doctors' cap may be of velvet.

The *hood*, worn around the neck so as to hang down the back, is the principal emblem of the nature and source of the degree and may be worn only after the degree has been granted. Bachelors' hoods are three feet long; masters' are three and one-half feet; and doctors' hoods have wide panels at the sides. The color edging the hood defines the nature of the degree while the lining of silk bears the colors of the institution that granted the degree.

The degree colors are appropriate to the category of the degree rather than to the scholar's major subject. For example, the appropriate color for degrees in Arts and Letters (B.A., M.A., B.Litt.) is *white*; in Commerce, *drab*; in Education, *light blue*; in Engineering, *orange*; in Fine Arts, *brown*; in Humanities, *crimson*; in Laws, *purple*; in Library Science, *lemon*; in Medicine, *green*; in Music, *pink*; in Pharmacy, *olive*; in Philosophy (Ph.D.), *dark blue*; in Physical Education, *sage*; in Science, *golden yellow*; in Theology, *scarlet*. These colors are used for the edging of all hoods and may be used for the velvet facing and sleeve bars of doctors' gowns and for the tassels on bachelors' and masters' caps.

The *institutional colors* with which the hoods are lined indicate the university or college granting the degree. Among those hoods you will see worn by Delta State's faculty are those from Alabama, crimson and white; Arkansas, red and white; Central Missouri, red, white, and black; Columbia, light blue with white chevron; Duke, royal blue with white chevron; Emory, navy blue and gold; Florida, orange and blue; Indiana, crimson with white chevron; Louisiana State, purple with old gold; Michigan, maize and light blue; Mississippi, red with blue chevron; Mississippi State, maroon and white; Missouri, old gold and black; Southern Mississippi, gold and black; Tennessee, white with orange chevron; Texas, white above orange; Tulane, green and white; and Virginia, navy blue with orange.

The colors of Delta State University are green and white, adopted in the fall of 1925, the first quarter after opening, by the faculty and administration on the recommendation of an eight-member committee, including local residents William P. Moses and Doyle Garrett.

#### **BANNERS**

Each banner is comprised of six colors corresponding to the school colors and the academic disciplines located within each College of the University: Education and Human Sciences—Light Blue, Business and Aviation—Drab, Arts and Sciences—White, Nursing—Apricot, and Graduate Studies—Gold. The banner of each college is bordered on its sides by the color assigned to its discipline by academia, but, in keeping with the unity of the Delta State community, all six colors can be found on each banner. The university exists because of the integral relationships between each college, thus each college is represented by color in each banner.

#### College of Arts and Sciences

The quill pen denotes the obvious association of literature and art but also serves as a valuable symbol for the role of history, biological and social research, and music composition within this college. The five bold lines denote an unfinished composition but one that higher education can complete. Organic and geometric shapes are transferable symbols which link the arts and sciences.

The College of Arts and Sciences banner was donated by the William N. LaForge family in memory of Dr. William F. LaForge, the first Dean of the School of Arts and Sciences.

#### College of Business and Aviation

The key is symbolic of unlocking the door of knowledge to the world. The light of knowledge passes through the keyhole with the world at its center. The grid lines are associated with columns, charts, flight grids, and matrix patterns, comprising the many aspects of this globally-oriented college.

The College of Business and Aviation banner was donated by Mr. and Mrs. John P. Quon in memory of John C. Gibson and John Yurkow, Jr., for their outstanding contributions to the College.

#### College of Education & Human Sciences

The philosophy of learning is the foundation from which all knowledge grows. Thus, in the College of Education banner, philosophical quotations serve as the foundation for the tree of knowledge. A ray of sunlight symbolizes educational enlightenment while an opening is left for future learning.
