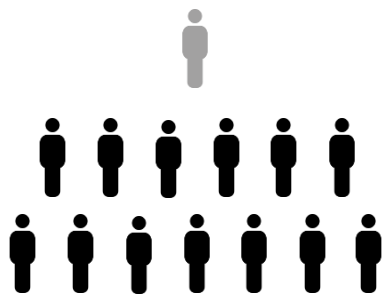

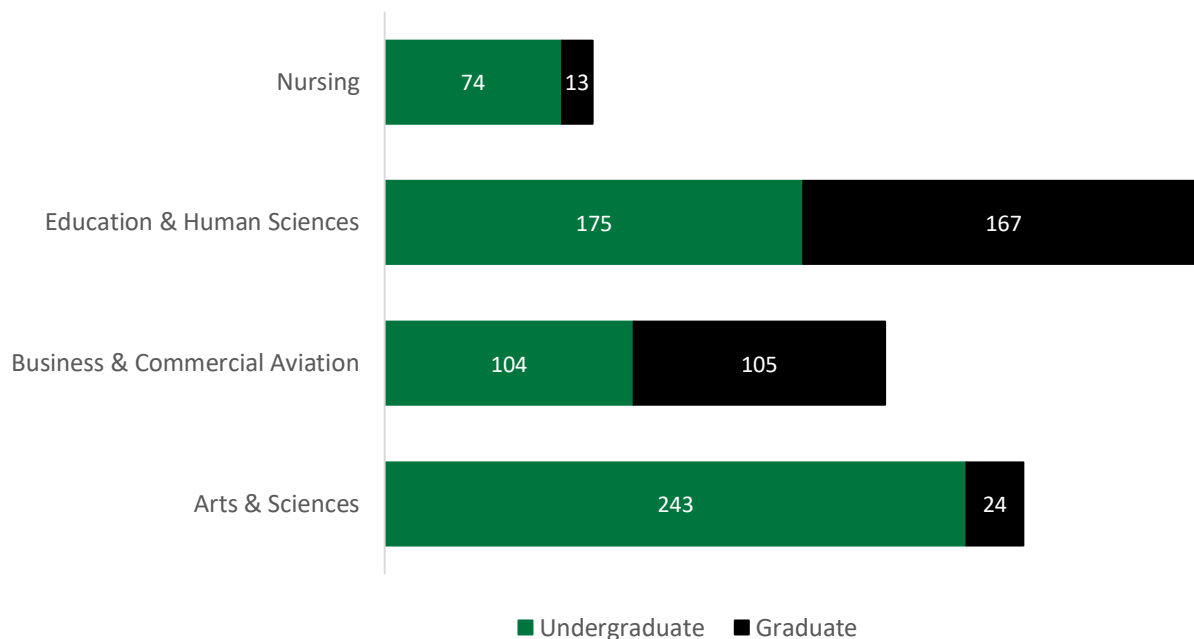

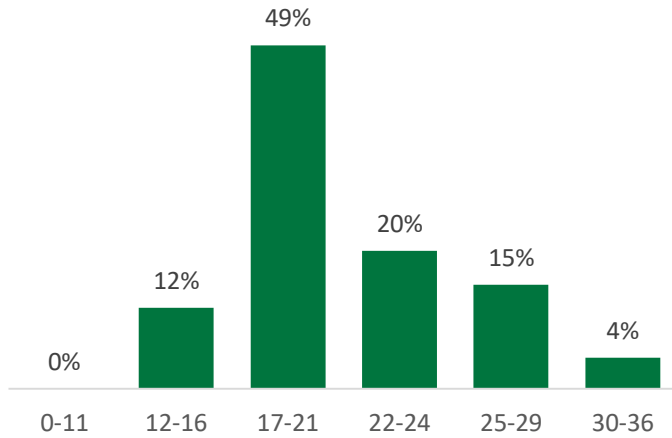

### Fall 2019 ACT Composite Score Distribution



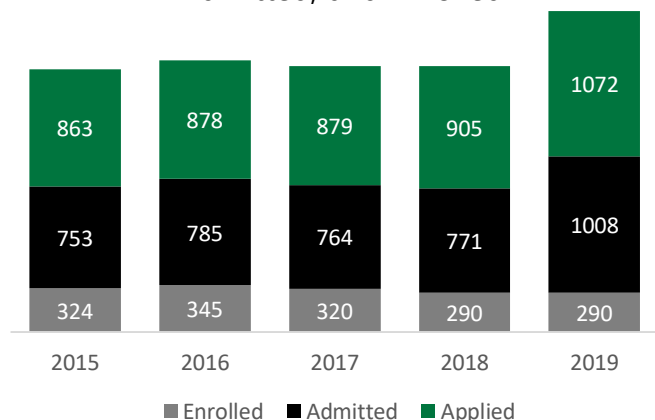

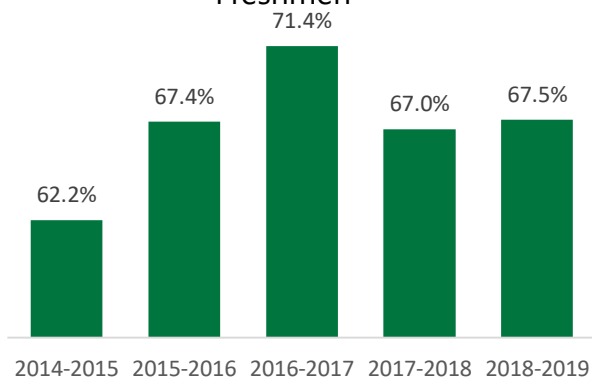
