FOREWORD

This is the first fact book compiled at Delta State University and it is the desire of the personnel in the Office of Institutional Research that it will provide a special need regarding data of the past at Delta State University. Insofar as possible, the data have been compiled on Students, Sports, Faculty, Physical Facilities, and Financial Data since the opening of the institution as Delta State Teachers' College in 1925. There are a number of gaps of information due to inability to locate adequate records in several areas, particularly in the area of sports. One area of concern which has been omitted is concerned with the required tests of the institution which specifically is the American College Test which has been required by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning since 1961. These data are currently being prepared and should appear as a supplement to this particular publication. The personnel of the Office of Institutional Research hopes that this publication will be updated periodically.

This first volume has been the combined efforts of many people, especially a number of the administrative officials of Delta State University who provided many of the data. To these administrators we owe a debt of gratitude.
