An entry numbered 11a should be placed behind page 11; 11b should follow 11a, etc.

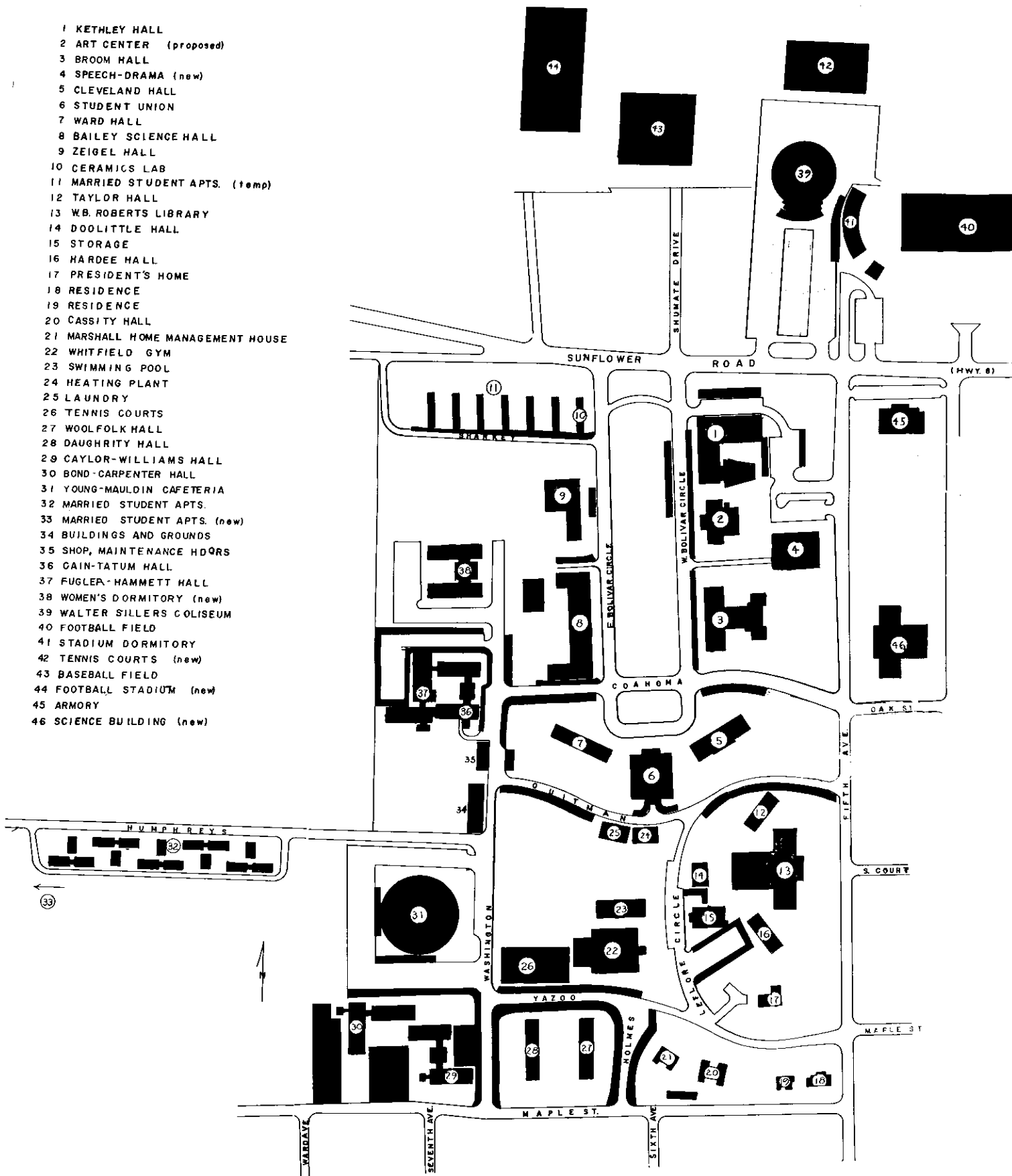
The Director of the Office of Research would like to express his sincere appreciation for the cooperation and efforts of all who made the compilation of this publication available.
