





INSTITUTIONAL MISSION

DESCRIPTION OF THE UNIVERSITY

Delta State is a public institution, receiving primary funding from the state; however, it also seeks and receives support from private and federal sources, as well as tuition revenue. The University provides a comprehensive undergraduate curriculum, offering 14 baccalaureate degrees in 44 majors. It also seeks to meet the need for advanced training in certain fields by providing programs of study for four master's degrees, the Educational Specialist degree, and the Doctor of Education degree.

Serving as the cultural and educational center of the region, Delta State University is located in Cleveland. The Mississippi Delta, a twenty-county, northwestern region, which is rich in various ethnic and cultural groups, provides approximately 80 percent of the University's enrollment. Between 10 and 15 percent of the students attend from other parts of the state, while slightly under 10 percent of the students reside outside the state. Accordingly, the University identifies the Delta as its primary public service region, while acknowledging the importance of research and service that will also benefit the state and nation.

PHILOSOPHY AND VALUES

The philosophy of Delta State is best expressed by its commitment to provide educational and cultural experiences designed to enhance and fulfill the potential of all persons without regard to race, religion, national origin, sex, or age. Furthermore, as students have diverse goals, backgrounds, and limitations on their finances, time, and mobility, the University, through its programs and support services, provides a variety of activities and growth opportunities. At the heart of its curriculum, the University provides an undergraduate education in the arts and sciences, business, education, and nursing. Graduate study in education and business and continuing education programs in a variety of areas also prepare the student for leadership roles. A comprehensive student affairs program is designed to support the academic structure of the University.

DESCRIPTION OF STUDENTS

Delta State offers these educational experiences to a student body from a broad range of cultural, socio-economic, and racial backgrounds. Twenty percent of the students belong to racial minority groups. Approximately 75 percent of its students, relatively balanced numerically by gender, attend the institution full-time, with 40 percent living in University housing. While many of its students come from middle socio-economic levels, the institution is committed to providing access and support for qualified students from all backgrounds. The numbers of students pursuing degrees in the Schools of Arts and Sciences, Business, and Education are comparable, with smaller numbers in the School of Nursing and in various pre-professional areas.

FUNCTIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY

The University provides an atmosphere conducive to intellectual, cultural, moral, physical, and social development. While placing emphasis on the high quality of its instructional program, Delta State recognizes the close connection between instruction and scholarly research. To achieve its goals, the University retains an outstanding faculty, dedicated to teaching, creative scholarly activity, and public service. In each of these areas, the institution provides the necessary educational support, physical resources, and administrative services to create a community of scholars in which knowledge is both shared and generated.

SKILLS AND ATTITUDES ACQUIRED BY STUDENTS

The primary "product" of Delta State is its undergraduate student. The University provides a program in general, undergraduate education, emphasizing cultural development, communication, and computation, along with an understanding - both appreciative and critical - of human achievement. As a result, students develop the ability to understand and evaluate the thoughts of others and to express their own thoughts effectively. From their major discipline, students gain a depth of understanding in one or more fields of learning, including the techniques of research and performance identified with those fields. The University also strives to provide for students the opportunity to develop human relations skills through participation in extracurricular activities and involvement with student organizations. Finally, graduates are encouraged to maintain close ties with the University as they make contributions to society whether through employment or advanced study.

DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY

In response to the needs of students, Delta State University is large enough to offer a wide range of high-quality programs and, at the same time, small enough to provide a friendly environment, limited-enrollment classes, and opportunity for significant student - faculty interactions. Delta State takes pride in its past and its present, but its future holds virtually unlimited promise: the quality of life in the Mississippi Delta will be crucially linked with the University's commitment to excellence in instruction, in research, and in public service.

UNIVERSITY GOALS

Delta State University strives to fulfill the following goals:

The Curriculum

- 1. Define the general education requirements to ensure that courses adequately address basic skills, knowledge, and competencies desirable for effectively pursuing careers, citizenship, and a richer personal life.
- 2. Provide opportunities throughout the curriculum for students to further develop their skills in writing and in critical thinking.
- 3. Improve computer literacy for all students by making computer services available and by facilitating the use of appropriate software packages in courses throughout the curriculum.
- 4. Provide a curriculum that ensures that majors are properly prepared in their chosen fields to complete licensure requirements, enter the work force, and continue advanced study in graduate or professional school.
- 5. Enhance educational experiences at all levels by providing student internships and other career development opportunities and by encouraging student research and other creative work.
- 6. Maintain a strong graduate program which provides opportunities for advanced study and research in selected fields.
- 7. Provide the resources and assistance to support the disciplines, including modern instructional equipment, a strong library and media center, computer facilities, and other services required for instruction, research, and public service.
- 8. Establish and maintain performance standards in all areas, with regular assessment of all programs, using indicators such as examination results, achievements of graduates, student and alumni opinion, and professional peer review.

The Students

- 9. Recruit students who can meet performance standards and contribute to the academic excellence of the University.
- 10. Increase student retention by providing a support program with the following attributes: a comprehensive system of advising and other services to enhance student development; increased financial support to students through scholarships, assistantships, grants, and loans; a developmental studies program for under-prepared students in mathematics, English, reading, and study skills; opportunities to meet or communicate with prospective employers or admission personnel from graduate or professional school.

11. Provide a rich campus life with a variety of cultural and extracurricular activities and other opportunities for personal development; provide through comprehensive intramural and athletic programs the opportunities to participate in recreational and intercollegiate sports.

The Faculty

- 12. Attract and maintain a highly qualified and creative faculty skilled in teaching, service, research, and other scholarly activity.
- 13. Provide sufficient faculty in all disciplines to maintain a student-teacher ratio that ensures opportunities for meaningful intellectual interaction between students and faculty.
- 14. Strengthen the faculty in their pursuit of scholarship in teaching, service, and research through a comprehensive program of faculty development and renewal, including appropriate support services, resources, and personnel.

The Environment

- 15. Maintain a climate of involvement in which faculty, staff, students, and administrators work together to provide the optimal environment for living and learning.
- 16. Provide the facilities and the physical environment which contribute to the intellectual, cultural, moral, physical, and social growth and development of the student and of the surrounding community.
- 17. Provide administrative services and auxiliary enterprises which are effective and efficient in the support of the institutional mission.
- 18. Expand the pursuit of external funding for instruction, research, student financial aid, and other needs.
- 19. Increase the involvement of alumni in the life and support of the University.
- 20. Accommodate non-traditional students and the general public by offering a comprehensive program of continuing education, including off-campus classes, independent-study courses by correspondence, non-credit courses, conferences, and workshops.
- 21. Strengthen the cooperative relationships with business and industry, service organizations, and other institutions.

Annual Report Dr. Kent Wyatt, President Delta State University 1992-93

Delta State University experienced a productive year in 1992-93. Enrollment and semester credit hour production remained strong and there were many positive accomplishments throughout the University.

In the fall semester of 1992, the headcount enrollment was 3756. Of this number, 3631 were enrolled on campus. Credit hour production remained stable. Delta State's minority enrollment was 23%, which continues to be the highest percentage among the public four-year universities. At spring commencement a total of 639 baccalaureate degrees, 128 masters' degrees, 23 educational specialist degrees, and 3 doctoral degrees were awarded.

Quality in the instructional program remains the University's highest priority. Reflecting this commitment were several noteworthy accomplishments by academic departments as well as individual faculty.

The Art Department received reaffirmation of its accreditation by the National Association of Schools of Art and Design. The Department of Biological Sciences was designated to house the Mississippi Center for Creative and Critical Thinking. The School of Nursing had a 100% pass rate on the first-write of the National Council Licensing Exam. The Departments of Physical Sciences and Biological Sciences initiated a "Program of Excellence" with a \$20,000 grant from the Elliott Mastology center in Baton Rouge that will emphasize summer research and scholarship opportunities for science students. The program will also bring in national speakers in the biomedical research field to interact with faculty and students.

Individual faculty across campus produced an impressive record of scholarly activity and

research as well as involvement in leadership roles in professional organizations. Terry Everett, Assistant Professor of English, and Mary Anne Ross, Associate Professor of Art, collaborated on an illustrated book of poetry entitled Work of Two Hands. Professor Everett also collaborated with David Caudill, Professor of Music, on an original composition, which was published by Boosey and Hawkes of New York. Drs. Lon Seiger, Ken Vanderpool, and Duke Barnes, professors in the Division of Health, Physical Education, and Recreation, collaborated on a new textbook, Fitness and Wellness Concepts. Gary Hemphill, Chair of the Commercial Aviation Department, served as Executive Director of the National Intercollegiate Flying Association and Francis Denton, Professor of Secondary Education, served as President of the Southeastern Regional Association of teacher Educators.

In support of the teaching mission of the University, Delta State engaged in a faculty development program during the year. Through a grant from the University Foundation in collaboration with institutional funds, the University was able to bring in guest lecturers, lend support for scholarly programs, and provide resources for faculty to participate in extended training in their disciplines. Among the programs supported through faculty development were a training program on the national licensing exam for Nursing faculty, a guest lecture on the Inca culture by a visiting anthropologist, and a faculty-wide workshop on teaching critical thinking.

The high points in the academic year were Honors Day and Commencement. Honors Day is a longstanding tradition where recognition is given to outstanding student achievements. The "Jack Gunn Award," named in honor of the former academic dean, and considered to be the top academic honor, was presented to Sherry Jeanine Woodard, a Nursing major from Clarksdale, Mississippi. The speaker for Honors Day was Richard Sullivan, Professor of Chemistry at Jackson State University. The spring Commencement graduating class of 793 was among the

largest in the institution's history. The speaker at graduation was Robert Dearing, a state legislator from Natchez, who is also a Delta State alumnus. Eloise Walker, Associate Professor of Elementary Education, was presented the S.E. Kossman Outstanding Teacher Award at Commencement.

Complementing the academic program was an extensive offering of cultural events. The Special Programs Committee sponsored six programs. "Mississippi Freedom," a theater event based on personal stories of the civil rights era, was among the highlights. The University also broke ground on a new performing arts facility which, when completed, will allow a significant expansion of the University's opportunities for providing cultural events to Delta State students and citizens of the region and State.

Service has become an increasingly important part of the University's mission. The report of the Lower Mississippi Delta Commission made numerous recommendations on how the universities can play a stronger role in improving economic and educational opportunities for this area. Delta State has undertaken a number of initiatives toward that end.

The University named Tom McClure of the University of Western Carolina to fill the B.F. Smith Chair for Economic Development. This endowed chair will give direction to University efforts to become more involved in the economic development of our region and state.

Other service accomplishments included a first place to the Social Work program's Delta Volunteers Project by the Governor's Initiative for Volunteer Excellence (GIVE). This program provides community service opportunities for Delta State students. Also, the Commercial Aviation Department co-sponsored an Aviation Careers Education (ACE) with the Federal Aviation Administration. The ACE program provides career awareness in the aerospace industry to high school students.

The intercollegiate athletic program had another outstanding year. Both the men's basketball team and women's basketball team won Gulf South Conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Division II Tournament. The women's basketball team finished second in the national tournament. All other sports teams performed competitively in the Gulf South Conference, generally recognized as the strongest Division II conference in the country.

Several notable changes occurred in key administrative positions. Richard Myers, Director of Institutional Research and Professor of Chemistry, was named Dean of the School of Arts and Sciences. Ross Story, Dean of Continuing Education was named Dean of Counseling and Developmental Studies. Leroy Morganti, Director of Public Information, was named Vice-President of Institutional Advancement. In a cost-saving measure, continuing education responsibilities were transferred to the school deans and the Office of Institutional Research was reorganized.

Facilities have long been a source of pride at Delta State. The University makes a special effort to provide a modern, clean, and well-equipped physical plant for its students, employees and constituents. The ground-breaking for the performing arts facility was a major accomplishment toward this end. This facility has long been at the top of the University's building priority list and it is particularly gratifying to see it become a reality. Delta State also began construction of a 12,000 square foot addition to the Wright Art Center and is near completion of a new women's dormitory. The University was awarded two Institutional Conservation Program grants from the Department of Energy and Transportation. The two grants are to help construct chill water loops and total \$85,000.

In spite of successes in 1992-93, Delta State is still experiencing the negative effects of consistent underfunding. As Delta State's funding per student has declined in recent years, the

University has been forced to make budget cuts in strategic areas. At best, the University is maintaining current programs with minimal support. There has been no opportunity to expand resource support in areas of growth. The University has reached a point, at which, educational quality is in danger of being compromised by inadequate funding. Hopefully, the Mississippi Legislature will intercede on behalf of its citizens and provide the necessary funding to meet the educational needs of our state.

As Delta State begins the 1993-94 school year, it does so with a sense of optimism. Revenues are up and the economic outlook has greatly improved in the state. The University is hopeful that the Board of Trustees and the Mississippi Legislature will invest some of the new revenue in educational initiatives that will benefit higher education in the state. The University is also optimistic because it has so many valuable allies who have a commitment to Delta State. The Board of Trustees, alumni, students, employees, and friends are commended for their devotion to this institution and its mission. With appreciation for their support, Delta State looks forward to 1993-94 as an exciting and productive year.

UNIVERSITY CHARACTERISTICS

Location: Delta State University is located in Cleveland, Mississippi, in the heart of the Mississippi Delta. The campus consists of 274.16 acres of land within or adjoining the western corporate limits. Cleveland is considered a rural city with a population of 15,384, and is situated in Bolivar County, which has a population 41,875. The nearest large city is 110 miles north in Memphis. The nearest international airport is located in Memphis, TN. Regional airport facilities are located in Greenville, MS which is 40 miles southwest of Cleveland, and the nearest municipal airport is located within Cleveland's city limits.

History: Delta State University was created as Delta State Teachers College on April 9, 1924. institution opened for its first regular session on September 15, 1925. The growth and expanding function of the institution were evidenced by its name change in 1955 to Delta State College. In 1969, Delta State was authorized to reorganize its academic structure into four schools within the institution. The School of Arts and Sciences and the School of Business were activated in 1969, while a School of Education and a School of Graduate Studies were implemented in 1970. On March 15, 1974, the institution was officially designated Delta State University. The first president of Delta State was Mr. James Wesley Broom. He was succeeded by Dr. W. M. Kethley, who served as president from 1926 to 1956. Dr. James Milton Ewing became the third president on September 1, 1956, and he served until his retirement on July 31, 1971. Dr. Ewing was succeeded by Dr. Aubrey Lucas, who served from August 1, 1971, until June 30, 1975. On July 1, 1975, Dr. Forest Kent Wyatt became the fifth and present president of Delta State University.

Academic Year: The University operates on the semester system with the fall semester beginning in late August and ending before Christmas. The spring semester begins in January and ends in May. There is a ten-week summer session.

Enrollment: The total on-campus enrollment for Fall 1992 was 3,631. The total off-campus enrollment for Fall 1992 was 125: 47 in Greenville, 78 in other locations. Students came from 28 states and 8 foreign countries.

Housing: The University has 14 residence halls with a capacity of 1556. There are 8 national fraternities and 6 national sororities. Approximatley 15% of the undergraduate men are members of a fraternity and 18% of the women are members of a sorority.

Athletics: The University is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) at the division II level.

Accreditation: Delta State University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award bachelors, masters, and doctoral degrees.

<u>Degrees:</u> The University offers 12 bachelor's degrees, 4 Master's degrees, 1 Specialist degree and 1 Doctoral degree. In May 1993 DSU awarded 639 bachelor's degrees, 128 master's, 23 specialists, and 3 doctoral.

<u>Faculty:</u> DSU employed 244 faculty in the Fall 1992 of which 159 were full-time and 85 part-time. 46% held Doctoral degrees.

<u>Student Fees:</u> Tuition and fees for Mississippi residents are \$1097 and for non-residents 2077 per semester. Dorm student's fees are \$885 per semester.

<u>Library:</u> The W.B. Roberts library collections consist of 263,891 bound volumes, 715,580 Microforms, 95,118 U.S. Government Documents, and 1,455 subscriptions.

<u>Fine Arts:</u> The Fielding Wright Art Center houses the art department and contains three galleries for hanging exhibitions. Currently under construction are a large annex for the art department and a Fine Arts building.




















Refecting the quality of the education provided by the University has been the performance of graduates in professional schools and career fields, including the following:

- * Delta State graduates have one of the highest success rates in the Southeast on scores and passing percentage on the Certified Public Accountants Examination
- * The acceptance rate of DSU graduates who apply to medical schools is 10 percent higher than the national average
- * Eighty percent of graduates who apply for dental school are accepted, and their composite scores on the Dental Admissions Test are above the state average
- * The School of Nursing has one of the highest success rates in the state on the National Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses; more than 97% of graduates have been licensured.
- * Delta State graduates traditionally score near the top in the state in percentage of passing scores on the National Teacher Examination
- * In a recent survey of alumni, DSU graduates were nearly unanimous in stating that the University had adequately and professionally prepared them for their career fields.

An Alumni Survey conducted in February 1993 by the Office of Institutional Research illustrated the following to the question, "How Satisfied were you with your overall experience at DSU at the time of your graduation?"







DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY COMPUTING ENVIRONMENT 1992 - 1993

Delta State has recently purchased a new administrative automation system consisting of three major parts. They are: 1) Fiber Optic LAN running ETHERNET and TCP/IP, 2) IBM RISC/6000 computer system, and 3) Relational Database Management System.

- 1) Local Area Network (LAN) The LAN consists of multimode fiber connecting 14 main campus buildings. The inside wire is AT&T's 10 base T. There are 4 hub buildings and a ring-topology is utilized with built-in redundancy.
- 2) Computer System Delta State has one large RISC/6000 running as the host computer and is attached to the LAN through an Ethernet adapter. Each hub building has a small RISC/6000 Ethernet connected to the LAN and driving terminals, PC's, and printers within that building. Located in the other buildings where there are a large number of I/O devices are 3 small RISC/6000 systems. The remaining buildings are using Terminal servers as I/O device handlers. The major operating system utilized on all RS/6000 systems is UNIX.
- 3) Database Management Systems (DBMS) The main database engine used at Delta State is ORACLE. It is a fourth generation system and is SQL based. ORACLE has its own Tool Kit for entering and retrieving information. The SCT Banner applications using ORACLE DBMS are: (1) Student Information System (2) Financial Aid System (3) Human Resources System (4) Financial Accounting System, and (5) Alumni/Foundation System. The Loan Collection System has been converted and is running under the UNIX operating system.

This system is currently supporting 150 terminals and 200 additional terminals are planned. All Academic and Administrative buildings are connected with the fiber optic network.

The Student System and the Financial Aid System "went live" in the Summer 1992, Human Resource in January 1993, Financial Accounting System in July 1993, and the Alumni/Foundation System will begin their training in October 1993 and is planned to go into production in 1994.









#### 1992-1993 FUNDS REVENUES BY SOURCE


