



INSTITUTIONAL MISSION

DESCRIPTION OF THE UNIVERSITY

Delta State is a public institution, receiving primary funding from the state; however, it also seeks and receives support from private and federal sources, as well as tuition revenue. The University provides a comprehensive undergraduate curriculum, offering 14 baccalaureate degrees in 44 majors. It also seeks to meet the need for advanced training in certain fields by providing programs of study for four master's degrees, the Educational Specialist degree, and the Doctor of Education degree.

Serving as the cultural and educational center of the region, Delta State University is located in Cleveland. The Mississippi Delta, a twenty-county, northwestern region, which is rich in various ethnic and cultural groups, provides approximately 80 percent of the University's enrollment. Between 10 and 15 percent of the students attend from other parts of the state, while slightly under 10 percent of the students reside outside the state. Accordingly, the University identifies the Delta as its primary public service region, while acknowledging the importance of research and service that will also benefit the state and nation.

PHILOSOPHY AND VALUES

The philosophy of Delta State is best expressed by its commitment to provide educational and cultural experiences designed to enhance and fulfill the potential of all persons without regard to race, religion, national origin, sex, or age. Furthermore, as students have diverse goals, backgrounds, and limitations on their finances, time, and mobility, the University, through its programs and support services, provides a variety of activities and growth opportunities. At the heart of its curriculum, the University provides an undergraduate education in the arts and sciences, business, education, and nursing. Graduate study in education and business and continuing education programs in a variety of areas also prepare the student for leadership roles. A comprehensive student affairs program is designed to support the academic structure of the University.

DESCRIPTION OF STUDENTS

Delta State offers these educational experiences to a student body from a broad range of cultural, socio-economic, and racial backgrounds. Twenty percent of the students belong to racial minority groups. Approximately 75 percent of its students, relatively balanced numerically by gender, attend the institution full-time, with 40 percent living in University housing. While many of its students come from middle socio-economic levels, the institution is committed to providing access and support for qualified students from all backgrounds. The numbers of students pursuing degrees in the Schools of Arts and Sciences, Business, and Education are comparable, with smaller numbers in the School of Nursing and in various pre-professional areas.

FUNCTIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY

The University provides an atmosphere conducive to intellectual, cultural, moral, physical, and social development. While placing emphasis on the high quality of its instructional program, Delta State recognizes the close connection between instruction and scholarly research. To achieve its goals, the University retains an outstanding faculty, dedicated to teaching, creative scholarly activity, and public service. In each of these areas, the institution provides the necessary educational support, physical resources, and administrative services to create a community of scholars in which knowledge is both shared and generated.

SKILLS AND ATTITUDES ACQUIRED BY STUDENTS

The primary "product" of Delta State is its undergraduate student. The University provides a program in general, undergraduate education, emphasizing cultural development, communication, and computation, along with an understanding - both appreciative and critical - of human achievement. As a result, students develop the ability to understand and evaluate the thoughts of others and to express their own thoughts effectively. From their major discipline, students gain a depth of understanding in one or more fields of learning, including the techniques of research and performance identified with those fields. The University also strives to provide for students the opportunity to develop human relations skills through participation in extra-curricular activities and involvement with student organizations. Finally, graduates are encouraged to maintain close ties with the University as they make contributions to society whether through employment or advanced study.

DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY

In response to the needs of students, Delta State University is large enough to offer a wide range of high-quality programs and, at the same time, small enough to provide a friendly environment, limited-enrollment classes, and opportunity for significant student - faculty interactions. Delta State takes pride in its past and its present, but its future holds virtually unlimited promise: the quality of life in the Mississippi Delta will be crucially linked with the University's commitment to excellence in instruction, in research, and in public service.

UNIVERSITY GOALS

Delta State University strives to fulfill the following goals:

The Curriculum

- Define the general education requirements to ensure that courses adequately address basic skills, knowledge, and competencies desirable for effectively pursuing careers, citizenship, and a richer personal life.
- 2. Provide opportunities throughout the curriculum for students to further develop their skills in writing and in critical thinking.
- 3. Improve computer literacy for all students by making computer services available and by facilitating the use of appropriate software packages in courses throughout the curriculum.
- 4. Provide a curriculum that ensures that majors are properly prepared in their chosen fields to complete licensure requirements, enter the work force, and continue advanced study in graduate or professional school.
- Enhance educational experiences at all levels by providing student internships and other career development opportunities and by encouraging student research and other creative work.
- 6. Maintain a strong graduate program which provides opportunities for advanced study and research in selected fields
- 7. Provide the resources and assistance to support the disciplines, including modern instructional equipment, a strong library and media center, computer facilities, and other services required for instruction, research, and public service.
- 8. Establish and maintain performance standards in all areas, with regular assessment of all programs, using indicators such as examination results, achievements of graduates, student and alumni opinion, and professional peer review.

The Students

- 9. Recruit students who can meet performance standards and contribute to the academic excellence of the University.
- 10. Increase student retention by providing a support program with the following attributes: a comprehensive system of advising and other services to enhance student development; increased financial support to students through scholarships, assistantships, grants, and loans; a developmental studies program for under-prepared students in mathematics, English, reading, and study skills; opportunities to meet or communicate with prospective employers or admission personnel from graduate or professional school.

11. Provide a rich campus life with a variety of cultural and extracurricular activities and other opportunities for personal development; provide through comprehensive intramural and athletic programs the opportunities to participate in recreational and intercollegiate sports.

The Faculty

- 12. Attract and maintain a highly qualified and creative faculty skilled in teaching, service, research, and other scholarly activity.
- 13. Provide sufficient faculty in all disciplines to maintain a student-teacher ratio that ensures opportunities for meaningful intellectual interaction between students and faculty.
- 14. Strengthen the faculty in their pursuit of scholarship in teaching, service, and research through a comprehensive program of faculty development and renewal, including appropriate support services, resources, and personnel.

The Environment

- 15. Maintain a climate of involvement in which faculty, staff, students, and administrators work together to provide the optimal environment for living and learning.
- 16. Provide the facilities and the physical environment which contribute to the intellectual, cultural, moral, physical, and social growth and development of the student and of the surrounding community.
- 17. Provide administrative services and auxiliary enterprises which are effective and efficient in the support of the institutional mission.
- 18. Expand the pursuit of external funding for instruction, research, student financial aid, and other needs.
- 19. Increase the involvement of alumni in the life and support of the University.
- 20. Accommodate non-traditional students and the general public by offering a comprehensive program of continuing education, including off-campus classes, independent-study courses by correspondence, non-credit courses, conferences, and workshops.
- 21. Strengthen the cooperative relationships with business and industry, service organizations, and other institutions.

Annual Report Dr. Kent Wyatt, President Delta State University 1993-94

Delta State University overcame a devastating and disruptive ice storm in February, 1994, to record an excellent year in the fulfillment of the University's mission. With the assistance of other universities and schools, the U.S. Forestry Department, and the Mississippi Agriculture Department, Delta State was able to restore essential services after an 11 day shutdown and to refocus its efforts and attention on the educational and cultural experiences of the students. Despite the ice storm and the uncertainty surrounding the Ayers case, Delta State was successful in gaining additional support from the state legislature, increasing enrollment and student credit hour production, expanding public service programs, and achieving new growth and recognition in the academic area.

The University continued its tradition of expending the major portion of its budget on Academics. Expenditures for Instruction and Academic Support in 1993-94 represented 64 percent of the total educational and general budget. While placing emphasis on the high quality of its instructional program, Delta State recognizes the close connection between instructional and scholarly research. The University identifies the Delta as its primary public service region, while acknowledging the importance of research and service that will benefit the state and nation.

Delta State experienced a 6% increase in enrollment during the Fall 1993 semester over the Fall semester of 1992. The headcount enrollment for Fall 1993 was 3906, of which 3841 were enrolled on campus. Credit hour production also increased from 45,884 in the Fall 1992 semester to 46,611 in the Fall 1993 semester. Delta State continues to have the largest minority enrollment (24 percent) of the public four-year universities. At spring commencement, a total of 654 baccalaureate degrees, 116 masters degrees, 3 specialist degrees, and 9 doctoral degrees were

awarded. The number of doctoral degrees awarded was the highest in the history of the doctoral program.

A special highlight of 1993-94 was the completion of all requirements for reaffirmation of accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). The Visitation Committee, under the direction of Dr. Fred Obear, Chancellor of the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, spent four days on campus in March reviewing the self-study and evaluating the University in accordance with SACS accreditation standards. At the conclusion of their visit, Dr. Obear, on behalf of Committee members, reported:

"Throughout the visit, it became clear to committee members that Delta State benefits greatly from a positive campus climate; high morale among its faculty, staff and students; and genuine pride in the surrounding community for the presence of the university as well as appreciation for the resource it represents. The committee commends the institution for fostering these relationships."

Formal notification of reaffirmation by SACS is anticipated at its December 1994 meeting.

Efforts toward national accreditation for all academic programs continued to be an important University goal. Highlighting these efforts was the completion of requirements by the School of Business for national accreditation by the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP) during the 1993-94 year. The business programs at the undergraduate and graduate levels should receive accreditation at the 1995 Annual Conference of ACBSP in June 1995. Also, the Office of Field Experiences underwent its annual review by the State Office of Certification. All standards were checked through a random inspection of specific files, and all standards were passed.

There were many achievements in the academic areas across campus during the year. The Office of Field Experiences conducted several Mississippi Teacher Assessment Instrument (MTAI) workshops for school districts in the surrounding area and also coordinated a weeklong math and science workshop for high school teachers.

Behavioral Science faculty served as consultants and/or volunteers for school districts, Youth Court, Department of Human Services, mental Health, Drug Free programs, Odyssey of the Mind, Special Olympics, United Way, and other community and state agencies. Delta State has the largest Student Council for Exceptional Children in the state, and Delta State is represented on the State Task Force on Gifted Education.

The Health, Physical Education and Recreation Department provided several physiological assessments and fitness activities during 1993-94. These included a joint project between the Division, the DSU Student Health Center, and Bolivar County Hospital to compile blood profiles on students and community persons, plus three fitness activity classes available to the community. The Division also conducted five athletic tournaments, two age-group swim meets and a triathlon.

The Division of Home Economics completed CARENET, a program funded by the Department of Human Services to develop training modules for child care providers. CARENET workshops provided information for individuals interested in starting child care centers and/or for individuals wanting to improve the quality of care provided in existing centers.

The Division of Home Economics also began a study of requirements of the American Dietetics Association for an undergraduate program in nutrition/dietetics. In addition, preparation was begun to complete the Self-Study by the Division for reaccreditation by the American Home Economics Association.

The SouthEast Regional Vision for Education (SERVE) is the educational laboratory for the Southeast. SERVE has as one of its prime objectives the improvement of education in Mississippi with a special emphasis on the Mississippi River Delta region. The laboratory brings in external resources for the school districts of Mississippi. Partnerships through SERVE include: The Rural Teacher Network; Mississippi Delta Consortium; Onward to Excellence; Delta Project; Field Representative Program; Comprehensive Regional Center for Minority Participation of Minorities in Mathematics. Science, and Engineering; and, the Rural Systemic Initiative. Through its work

in Mississippi the past twelve months, SERVE has been able to provide services to teachers, administrators, school boards, the State Department of Education, independent educational projects, and institutions of higher education. Over 7,923 educators and policy makers in Mississippi have received services from SERVE. Other projects in which SERVE is involved include the Delta Area Association for Improvement of Schools, Delta Mathematics Project, Delta Principals Institute, Environmental Science Workshop, Educational Resource Center, and the Assistant Teacher Program.

Mr. Tony Wilson, Assistant Professor of Accounting, serves on the Mississippi Society of CPA's Advisory Board to the State Board of Accountancy. Also DSU accounting graduates continue to outperform the state average on the Certified Public Accountants (CPA) Examination. On the May 1994, Uniform CPA Examination, 28% of DSU graduates passed, compared to the overall pass rate of 17.5%. The Department of Accounting was approved to offer a Masters of Professional Accountancy and began enrolling students July 1, 1994.

DSU's Precision Flight Team placed first among eight schools in the National Safety and Flight Evaluation Conference. Mr. Gary Hemphill, Chairman and Professor, was reappointed as the Executive Director of National Intercollegiate Flying Association (NIFA) for 1993-94. His appointment continues the location of the national headquarters office at DSU. Also, the state Legislature appropriated \$350,000 for the purchase of a King Air flight simulator.

Dr. Mary Jean Lush, Division of Computer Information Systems and Office Administration, is the Publisher of The Journal of Vocational and Technical Education, a refereed professional journal published by Omicron Tau Theta, an honorary graduate professional society in vocational and technical education.

The number of Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) graduates was the largest since the school was established (36). DSU received funding for the establishment of a Master of Science in Nursing Program, and enrollment is expected to begin January 1995.

Eleven Delta State art students had work accepted for the annual Collegiate Art Competition at the Meridian Museum of Art, Meridian, MS. Four works received awards.

Biology Department students continued their dedication to helping each other survive college and grow as professionals through the use of the Personal Empowerment Program (PEP). Faculty members were involved in the organization of the Center for Creative and Critical Thinking and the Center for Science and Environmental Education within the department.

Science teachers in the Mississippi Delta will soon receive direct assistance from DSU in providing innovative science instruction for their students. The aid will be provided by the Center for Science and Environmental Education (CSEE), a collaborative project between Delta State University and SERVE. The center was established to provide a comprehensive support system for precollege science instructors and their students in the Delta.

The Delta Mathematics Project, administered through the Mathematics Department, received an Award for Excellence from the Public Education Forum of Mississippi. This award was based on the merits of the project and the fact that it exemplifies quality work in an area of FORUM emphasis: Administrator/Teacher competence.

The Department of Physical Science received five-year renewal of a grant from NASA. Approximately \$75,000 will be used to support women and minorities in science education. The department has established The Elliott Center of Excellence supported by Drs. Robert and Mary Elliott, alumni from Baton Rouge, Louisiana. The center functions to sponsor seminars and undergraduate research. The budget for this program is approximately \$20,000 annually. With a \$50,000 challenge gift from InfoLabs of Clarksdale, the Department has embarked on a \$2 million capital campaign to be completed by the year 2000. This project will support faculty and student development.

In the Social Work Department, Margaret Tullos was one of 11 people selected by the American Association of State Social Work Boards (AASSWB) to be an Item Writing Workshop

Facilitator. AASSWB is the group that administers the Social Work Licensure Exam in this country. Mrs. Tullos has the responsibility to do at least two workshops each year where social workers write items for the licensure exam.

The high points in the academic year were Honors Day and Commencement. Honors Day is a longstanding tradition where recognition is given to outstanding student achievements. The "Jack Gunn Award," named in honor of the former academic dean, and considered to be the top academic honor, was presented to Staci Michelle Broadway, a General Business major from Coldwater, Mississippi. The speaker for Honors Day was Mr. Clifton Taulbert, internationally acclaimed author and businessman from Tulsa, OK. Mr. Taulbert is chairperson of Freemount Corporation and a native of Glen Allen, Mississippi. His writings include Once Upon A Time When We Were Colored.

The spring commencement graduating class of 782 was among the largest in the institution's history. The speaker at graduation was The Honorable Willie Simmons, Mississippi Senator and Delta State alumnus. Dr. Jane Weare, coordinator of Teacher Education Research, and Professor of Research was the recipient of The S.E. Kossman Outstanding Teacher award. Established by the Kossman family of Cleveland in memory of their father, the award enables the University to present a cash award for teaching excellence. The H.L. Nowell Outstanding Support Staff Award was initiated during 1993-94 by the Nowell family of Cleveland. The award honors H.L. Nowell, who was employed by Delta State for over 40 years and was well known and respected for his work with students. This award was presented to Mrs. Penney Gong, Assistant to the Registrar.

The Delta State University W.B. Roberts Library installed a new CD-ROM Windows-based program during the 1993-94 year. Because of the increased number of workstations and the network, the library has been able to increase its databases from two to seven. The new CD-ROM service is a major component of the library's network with 17 CD-ROM drives that can be searched simultaneously by any user on the network.

In addition to Delta State's high emphasis on instruction, research is also an important component of the university's mission. In 1993-94, \$690,731 was awarded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the Center for Alluvial Plains Studies (CAPS) for agricultural research. With the current emphasis on studies of herbicides, CAPS is positioned to provide a leadership role in agricultural research in the Delta.

Two highly successful grants completed their multiple year funding this year. The Delta Volunteers, funded by ACTION, and the CARENET Program, funded by the State Department of Human Services, continue with programs that started from external funding.

New grants to the University included funding for two programs from the U.S. Department of Education for a Student Literacy Corps (\$99,426) and to improve mathematics instruction at public schools (\$350,000); funding from the National Science Foundation to strengthen minority participation in the sciences and mathematics (\$173,986) and a grant to promote student/faculty research (\$40,000). The Social Sciences received a grant for \$12,000 to provide a computer laboratory for student research. The University library received funding for improving its electronic cataloging system (\$50,000) from the U.S. Department of Education. Additionally, SERVE has funded the University (\$156,275) to develop a Center for Science and Environmental Education.

The Division of Health, Physical Education, and Recreation (HPER) received a grant from United Way of Bolivar County. The purpose of this grant was to establish a model for Bolivar County municipalities to provide community-based elementary basketball programs.

As part of the university's mission of outreach into the community, the Small Business Development Center (SBDC) counsels with current and prospective small business owners to improve and foster their success throughout the Mississippi Delta area. During the past year, the SBDC has worked with 185 clients, of which 40% were minority clients. Almost 1,000 hours of counseling produced 46 new or retained jobs with over \$1.1 million of actual investment into the

area. During this period, the SBDC conducted 20 workshops across the Delta on a variety of topics with 461 people in attendance. In addition, the Center honored the area's successful small business owners with "Excellence in Enterprise", a weeklong celebration of small business ownership with over 200 people participating.

Dr. Jerry Robinson, professor of rural sociology and program leader for the Department of Agricultural Economics of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, was named to fill the B.F. Smith Chair of Economic Development. The B.F. Smith Chair is a working partnership between Delta State University and its home region, the Mississippi Delta.

The intercollegiate athletic program had another outstanding year. Ray Bridges was named Coach of the Year, and his men's tennis team won the Gulf South Conference championship. The women's tennis team came in second. The baseball team finished third in the NCAA Division II World Series, and Coach Bill Marchant was named Regional and GSC Coach of the Year. Also Ronnie Mayers was named Coach of the Year for women's swimming in the New South Intercollegiate Swim League.

Delta State is continually striving to ensure that facilities are well maintained. During 1993, the Brumby-Castle Residence Hall for Women was completed and occupied. The addition to the Wright Art Center was completed and opened for classes at the start of the Fall 1994 semester. The Performing Arts Theater is 70% complete, and we are planning a grand opening series of performances for the Fall of 1995. Two chill water loops were completed and utilized for the summer semester in an effort to reduce air conditioning costs. In addition, we are developing plans to construct an Archives Facility, renovate Broom Hall, and accomplish general repair and renovations funded by the 1994 legislature. The repairs from the ice storm continue with funds from Federal Emergency Management Agency and House Bill 1872 of 1994. Tree replacement and landscaping repair will continue on through late Spring, 1995.

We still are behind in the area of instructional equipment, but most importantly in computer technology. We are forced to borrow through the Master Lease Program for equipment purchases.

The Delta State University staff wage and salary structure was created in order to provide a fair and equitable way to compensate staff and to have a salary grade for each position.

There were several administrative changes made during the past year. Dr. Leroy Morganti, former Director of Public Information was promoted to Vice President for University Advancement. Mr. Jody Correro, former Director of Sports Information, filled the Public Information vacancy, and Mr. Rick Kindhart was hired as Director of Sports Information. Dr. Don Skelton, former head football coach, assumed the position of Director of Alumni/Foundation. Mr. Todd Knight was hired as head Football Coach. Mr. David Sweet was employed as Director of the Physical Plant. The business office was reorganized into two components—the Bursar's office and the accounting office. This change involved moving the fee paying functions of the business office to the Student Union for easier access by the students. The Admissions Office was also restructured. The name was changed to the Office of School Relations and Recruitment, with Mrs. Betsy Elliot serving as the Director. Ms. Frances Short was named the Coordinator of Admissions, and this office was placed under the Registrar and Director of Admissions, Mr. James Donald Cooper.

Under the leadership of John Alexander, president, the Alumni Association enjoyed one of its most productive years since formal operations began in 1964. An alumni chapter was established in New Orleans, bringing the total number of out-of-state chapters to 10. Combined with the 35 in-state chapters, the Association offers meeting opportunities throughout the state and southeastern United States. In April a revised Alumni Directory was published and made available to alumni members. Emphasis was given to the establishment of a revised committee structure and new investment policy guidelines approved by the Association Board of Directors.

The DSU Foundation has grown steadily in assets and in the level and range of support it provides to Delta State's academic and student development programs. Following the adoption of a new investment policy in July 1990, financial assets have increased from \$1,515,683 and topped the \$3 million figure for the first time in 1993-94. Under the leadership of Louis Baioni, president, and the Board of Directors, emphasis has been given to establishing fund-rasing projects designed to maintain programs of academic excellence and to meet the challenges of the 21st century. Such a project is the 1993-94 establishment of "\$2 Million by 2000", which was conceived and initiated by Dean Spradling, a 1954 DSU alumnus. This fund-raising effort will create an endowment for biological and physical sciences. In addition the Foundation Board has approved a Feasibility Study, to be conducted in September, 1994, in preparation for a \$5 million capital campaign for the University.

The Foundation also continued to emphasize solicitation of funds to support the mission and teaching program of DSU. Development grants provided many opportunities for faculty to participate in scholarly programs and training exercises that help ensure the continuance of academic excellence.

The 1994-95 academic year is full of promise. Faculty and staff morale, bolstered in large part by increased recognition of the value of higher education by the state legislature, is high. Student enrollment numbers at this time project an increase. Our older facilities are scheduled to receive emergency repair and renovation, and our new Performing Arts Center is nearing completion. Two new graduate degrees, the Master of Science in Nursing and the Master of Professional Accountancy, will enhance our academic offerings and provide needed educational opportunities in the Delta. With these bright spots--along with the continued support of the Board of Trustees, the Mississippi Legislature, and alumni and friends, Delta State looks forward to a banner year in this, the 70th anniversary of its establishment.

UNIVERSITY CHARACTERISTICS

Location: Delta State University is located in Cleveland, Mississippi, in the heart of the Mississippi Delta. The campus consists of 274.16 acres of land within or adjoining the western corporate limits. Cleveland is considered a rural city with a population of 15,384, and is situated in Bolivar County, which has a population 41,875. The nearest large city is 110 miles north in Memphis. The nearest international airport is located in Memphis, TN. Regional airport facilities are located in Greenville, MS which is 40 miles southwest of Cleveland, and the nearest municipal airport is located within Cleveland's city limits.

History: Delta State University was created as Delta State Teachers College on April 9, 1924. The institution opened for its first regular session on September 15, 1925. The growth and expanding function of the institution were evidenced by its name change in 1955 to Delta State College. In 1969, Delta State was authorized to reorganize its academic structure into four schools within the institution. The School of Arts and Sciences and the School of Business were activated in 1969, while a School of Education and a School of Graduate Studies were implemented in 1970. On March 15, 1974, the institution was officially designated Delta State University. The first president of Delta State was Mr. James Wesley Broom. He was succeeded by Dr. W. M. Kethley, who served as president from 1926 to 1956. Dr. James Milton Ewing became the third president on September 1, 1956, and he served until his retirement on July 31, 1971. Dr. Ewing was succeeded by Dr. Aubrey Lucas, who served from August 1, 1971, until June 30, 1975. On July 1, 1975, Dr. Forest Kent Wyatt became the fifth and present president of Delta State University.

Academic Year: The University operates on the semester system with the fall semester beginning in late August and ending before Christmas. The spring semester begins in January and ends in May. There is a ten-week summer session.

Enrollment: The total on-campus enrollment for Fall 1993 was 3,841. The total off-campus enrollment for Fall 1993 was 65: 29 in Greenville, 36 in other locations. Students came from 32 states and 6 foreign countries.

Student Fees: Tuition and fees for Mississippi residents are \$1097 and for non-residents \$2214 per semester. Dorm student's fees are \$940 per semester.

Housing: The University has 15 residence halls with a capacity of 1681. There are 8 national fraternities and 6 national sororities. Approximatley 15% of the undergraduate men are members of a fraternity and 18% of the women are members of a sorority.

Athletics: The University is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) at the division II level.

Accreditation: Delta State University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award bachelors, masters, and doctoral degrees.

<u>Degrees:</u> The University offers 11 bachelor's degrees, 4 Master's degrees, 1 Specialist degree and 1 Doctoral degree. In May 1994 DSU awarded 654 bachelor's degrees, 116 master's, 3 specialists, and 9 doctoral.

<u>Faculty:</u> DSU employed 252 faculty in the Fall 1993 of which 162 were full-time and 70 part-time. 46% held Doctoral degrees.

<u>Library:</u> The W.B. Roberts library collections consist of 263,891 bound volumes, 715,580 Microforms, 95,118 U.S. Government Documents, and 1,455 subscriptions.

Fine Arts: The Fielding Wright Art Center houses the art department and contains three galleries for hanging exhibitions. The addition to the art center was opened in Fall 1994 and the Fine Arts building is scheduled to open in Spring 1995..


DELTA STATE UNIVERSITYON-CAMPUS HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT FALL 1984-1993








DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY DISTRIBUTION OF EMPLOYEES * FALL 1993



DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY TUITION AND FEES* 1984-1993






TOTAL EDUCATION AND GENERAL EXPENDITURES



1993-94 FUNDS REVENUES BY SOURCE




