INSTITUTIONAL MISSION

DESCRIPTION OF THE UNIVERSITY

Delta State is a public institution, receiving primary funding from the state; however, it also seeks and receives support from private and federal sources, as well as tuition revenue. The University provides a comprehensive undergraduate curriculum, offering 14 baccalaureate degrees in 44 majors. It also seeks to meet the need for advanced training in certain fields by providing programs of study for four master's degrees, the Educational Specialist degree, and the Doctor of Education degree.

Serving as the cultural and educational center of the region, Delta State University is located in Cleveland. The Mississippi Delta, a twenty-county, northwestern region, which is rich in various ethnic and cultural groups, provides approximately 80 percent of the University's enrollment. Between 10 and 15 percent of the students attend from other parts of the state, while slightly under 10 percent of the students reside outside the state. Accordingly, the University identifies the Delta as its primary public service region, while acknowledging the importance of research and service that will also benefit the state and nation.

PHILOSOPHY AND VALUES

The philosophy of Delta State is best expressed by its commitment to provide educational and cultural experiences designed to enhance and fulfill the potential of all persons without regard to race, religion, national origin, sex, or age. Furthermore, as students have diverse goals, backgrounds, and limitations on their finances, time, and mobility, the University, through its programs and support services, provides a variety of activities and growth opportunities. At the heart of its curriculum, the University provides an undergraduate education in the arts and sciences, business, education, and nursing. Graduate study in education and business and continuing education programs in a variety of areas also prepare the student for leadership roles. A comprehensive student affairs program is designed to support the academic structure of the University.

DESCRIPTION OF STUDENTS

Delta State offers these educational experiences to a student body from a broad range of cultural, socio-economic, and racial backgrounds. Twenty percent of the students belong to racial minority groups. Approximately 75 percent of its students, relatively balanced numerically by gender, attend the institution full-time, with 40 percent living in University housing. While many of its students come from middle socio-economic levels, the institution is committed to providing access and support for qualified students from all backgrounds. The numbers of students pursuing degrees in the Schools of Arts and Sciences, Business, and Education are comparable, with smaller numbers in the School of Nursing and in various preprofessional areas.

FUNCTIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY

The University provides an atmosphere conducive to intellectual, cultural, moral, physical, and social development. While placing emphasis on the high quality of its instructional program, Delta State recognizes the close connection between instruction and scholarly research. To achieve its goals, the University retains an outstanding faculty, dedicated to teaching, creative scholarly activity, and public service. In each of these areas, the institution provides the necessary educational support, physical resources, and administrative services to create a community of scholars in which knowledge is both shared and generated.

SKILLS AND ATTITUDES ACQUIRED BY STUDENTS

The primary "product" of Delta State is its undergraduate student. The University provides a program in general, undergraduate education, emphasizing cultural development, communication, and computation, along with an understanding - both appreciative and critical - of human achievement. As a result, students develop the ability to understand and evaluate the thoughts of others and to express their own thoughts effectively. From their major discipline, students gain a depth of understanding in one or more fields of learning, including the techniques of research and performance identified with those fields. The University also strives to provide for students the opportunity to develop human relations skills through participation in extra-curricular activities and involvement with student organizations. Finally, graduates are encouraged to maintain close ties with the University as they make contributions to society whether through employment or advanced study.

DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY

In response to the needs of students, Delta State University is large enough to offer a wide range of high-quality programs and, at the same time, small enough to provide a friendly environment, limited-enrollment classes, and opportunity for significant student - faculty interactions. Delta State takes pride in its past and its present, but its future holds virtually unlimited promise: the quality of life in the Mississippi Delta will be crucially linked with the University's commitment to excellence in instruction, in research, and in public service.

UNIVERSITY GOALS

Delta State University strives to fulfill the following goals:

The Curriculum

- Define the general education requirements to ensure that courses adequately address basic skills, knowledge, and competencies desirable for effectively pursuing careers, citizenship, and a richer personal life.
- 2. Provide opportunities throughout the curriculum for students to further develop their skills in writing and in critical thinking.
- 3. Improve computer literacy for all students by making computer services available and by facilitating the use of appropriate software packages in courses throughout the curriculum.
- 4. Provide a curriculum that ensures that majors are properly prepared in their chosen fields to complete licensure requirements, enter the work force, and continue advanced study in graduate or professional school.
- Enhance educational experiences at all levels by providing student internships and other career development opportunities and by encouraging student research and other creative work
- 6. Maintain a strong graduate program which provides opportunities for advanced study and research in selected fields
- 7. Provide the resources and assistance to support the disciplines, including modern instructional equipment, a strong library and media center, computer facilities, and other services required for instruction, research, and public service.
- 8. Establish and maintain performance standards in all areas, with regular assessment of all programs, using indicators such as examination results, achievements of graduates, student and alumni opinion, and professional peer review.

The Students

- 9. Recruit students who can meet performance standards and contribute to the academic excellence of the University.
- 10. Increase student retention by providing a support program with the following attributes: a comprehensive system of advising and other services to enhance student development; increased financial support to students through scholarships, assistantships, grants, and loans; a developmental studies program for under-prepared students in mathematics, English, reading, and study skills; opportunities to meet or communicate with prospective employers or admission personnel from graduate or professional school.

11. Provide a rich campus life with a variety of cultural and extracurricular activities and other opportunities for personal development; provide through comprehensive intramural and athletic programs the opportunities to participate in recreational and intercollegiate sports.

The Faculty

- 12. Attract and maintain a highly qualified and creative faculty skilled in teaching, service, research, and other scholarly activity.
- 13. Provide sufficient faculty in all disciplines to maintain a student-teacher ratio that ensures opportunities for meaningful intellectual interaction between students and faculty.
- 14. Strengthen the faculty in their pursuit of scholarship in teaching, service, and research through a comprehensive program of faculty development and renewal, including appropriate support services, resources, and personnel.

The Environment

- 15. Maintain a climate of involvement in which faculty, staff, students, and administrators work together to provide the optimal environment for living and learning.
- 16. Provide the facilities and the physical environment which contribute to the intellectual, cultural, moral, physical, and social growth and development of the student and of the surrounding community.
- 17. Provide administrative services and auxiliary enterprises which are effective and efficient in the support of the institutional mission.
- 18. Expand the pursuit of external funding for instruction, research, student financial aid, and other needs.
- 19. Increase the involvement of alumni in the life and support of the University.
- Accommodate non-traditional students and the general public by offering a comprehensive program of continuing education, including off-campus classes, independent-study courses by correspondence, non-credit courses, conferences, and workshops.
- 21. Strengthen the cooperative relationships with business and industry, service organizations, and other institutions.

Annual Report Dr. Kent Wyatt, President Delta State University 1994-95

Delta State University experienced many positive accomplishments during the 1994-95 academic year, the 70th anniversary of its establishment. Various new academic programs were approved, construction of the Performing Arts Center was finished, Avers case issues were addressed, ice storm recovery plans were completed, the wage and salary compensation scale was moved upward nine percent, and a \$5 million capital campaign was begun. Many of these accomplishments were made possible by the support of the state legislature, as evidenced by the 27% increase in state appropriations.

The spirits of Delta State students, employees, alumni, family, and friends were raised when the judgement of the Ayers case was released in March with no specific mention of closure of universities. Delta State has taken great strides to promote diversity on its campus and was encouraged by the outcome of the Ayers ruling which acknowledged the success of those efforts. One such achievement is Delta State's success in enrolling the largest percentage of minority students (26%) of the public four-year universities. Delta State has expanded these efforts by increasing the working relationship with Mississippi Valley State University (MVSU). Dr. Wyatt, members of the Administrative Cabinet, and various academic officers have met with representatives from MVSU on several occasions to discuss ways for the two universities to work collaboratively.

The University experienced an overall increase in enrollment during the Fall 1994 semester, despite projections which predicted enrollment to decrease 5% from the

previous year. This increase was due, in part, to the effort of the Continuing

Education/Distance Learning office which was instrumental in the 118% increase in offcampus enrollment during the Fall 1994 semester. Spring commencement also

experienced an increase in the total number of degrees awarded. There were 645

baccalaureate degrees, 133 masters degrees, 6 specialist degrees, and 10 doctoral degrees

awarded. The number of doctoral degrees surpassed last year's record for the highest
number of doctoral degrees awarded.

Delta State strives to maintain the high quality of its instructional program, which is evidenced by 92.8% of the instructional budget being used for teaching, the highest percentage of the eight public universities, according to the 1994-95 IHL Faculty Activity Report. Accreditation is also an important measure of the quality of University programs. Delta State received formal notification of reaffirmation of accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools at its annual meeting in December. Individual programs also received accreditation during the year. The Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP), a national accrediting agency, granted accreditation to the business degree programs. According to data extracted from the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business and the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs materials, only 17 percent of all business schools in the nation are nationally accredited. The Community Counseling program was reaccredited by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP) through 1997. Only 19 percent of the counseling programs nationwide are CACREP accredited. All academic programs at Delta State are nationally accreditated.

In the academic arena, three new masters programs were approved during the

Aviation, and Master of Science in Criminal Justice. A Family Nurse Practitioners and Adult Health Nurse Educators twelve-month graduate program was established in January, 1995, and will offer a Master of Science in Nursing. Nursing students continue to perform well on the licensure exam. The pass rate on the Registered Nurses Exam of the 1994 nursing class graduates was 100%. The Department of Accounting now offers a special MBA Program of Study - Executive Master of Business Administration. This program of study was approved for implementation in the Fall 1995 semester. The Master of Professional Accountancy program was implemented July 1, 1994, after receiving Board approval. The CPA examination pass rate also remains high. In May 1994, 28% of the Delta State students passed the exam, compared to a 17.5% pass rate for all candidates.

Several faculty members were recognized during the year. Dr. Jane Weare, Professor of Research and Coordinator of Teacher Education Research at Delta State, was among 77 outstanding students and faculty members from Mississippi institutions who received special recognition from the Mississippi Legislature. Dr. Weare was honored for her effectiveness in teaching, ability to motivate students, relationship with students in and out of the classroom, availability to students, professional activities, and attitude toward teaching and students. Dr. Henry Outlaw, Chair of the Biology Department, was named "Outstanding Chemist in Mississippi" for 1995 by the American Chemical Society. Dr. James Steen, Professor of Biological Sciences, was among 18 faculty members from the United States participating in a summer study program at Oxford (England) University. Dr. Pose Strahan, Chair of the Department of Mathematics, was selected to participate in

the First U.S./Russia Joint Conference on Education held in Moscow in October, 1994.

Dr. Leroy Morganti, Vice President for University Advancement, was selected to attend the Institute for Educational Management at Harvard University.

Delta State students also attained several honors. Robert (Rob) Patrick Armour,
DSU senior from Southaven, Mississippi, received special recognition from the Mississippi
Legislature. Students from the Division of Economics and Finance finished 15th out of 33
schools in the Personal Financial Planning Exam, with the mean score exceeding the
national average. One hundred percent of DSU graduates who sat for the real estate
brokerage, sales or appraisal licensure exams passed. One hundred percent of the DSU
graduates who sat for the property and casualty or life and health insurance exams passed.
Thirteen students from the CIS/OAD Department attended the Phi Beta Lamda State
Leadership Conference. Eight of these students placed in the top four in their divisions.
Three members will compete at the National Conference in Orlando, Florida in July, 1995.
On the Social Work Licensure Examination, 60 percent of DSU students passed, while the
state average is 42 percent.

Twelve DSU art students had 15 pieces of their works accepted for the 1995 Mississippi Collegiate Art Competition. This number represented 25% of the entire exhibition. The National Association of Schools of Art and Design has just given plan approval to add photography as an accredited concentration in the B.F.A. program at DSU. This is the only B.F.A. degree in the state with an emphasis in photography.

The international honor society in literature, Lambda Iota Tau, produces a magazine in which it publishes some of the best creative works by its members. This year, four of the ten published writers were from DSU.

For the first time in its history, the Commercial Aviation Department of DSU hosted the National Intercollegiate Flying Association's (NIFA) National SAFECON (Safety And Flight Evaluation Conference). The DSU Precision Flight Team placed first in the regional competition and qualified to compete at the 1995 NIFA National SAFECON.

The Division of Behavioral Sciences sponsored a Spring Conference for Helping Professions and a Summer Gifted Program, and served as consultants, volunteers, and/or board members for school districts and other community agencies.

The name of the Division of Home Economics was changed to Family and Consumer Sciences to reflect more accurately the philosophy of the synergistic nature of Family and Consumer Sciences.

Delta State University, established as a teacher's college, recognizes the need for universities and schools (K-12) to work together to increase the educational level of its citizens. Toward this effort, Delta State serves as the site for the Delta Association for Improvement of Schools (DAAIS) and the SouthEastern Regional Vision for Education (SERVE).

The Delta Association for Improvement of Schools, established and housed in the Delta State University School of Education, is a consortium of 36 school districts and institutions of higher learning in the Mississippi Delta. Dr. James Nicholson, Jr., who is a former Delta school district superintendent, serves as Executive Director. Funding for the DAAIS office, which was established April 1, 1994, is a cooperative effort with support coming from DSU, the consortium members, SouthEastern Regional Vision for Education, and the Phil Harding Foundation. A goal of DAAIS is to improve teaching

and learning in ways that are best done through the collaboration of school districts, institutions of higher learning, the State Department of Education, and/or other agencies.

The DSU Division of Curriculum and Instruction and the Delta Association for Improvement of Schools group developed a teacher/administrator resource center that will serve as a model for our region and state.

The SouthEastern Regional Vision for Education is the educational laboratory for the Southeast. SERVE has as one of its prime objectives the improvement of education in Mississippi with a special emphasis on the Mississippi River Delta region. The laboratory brings in external resources for the school districts of Mississippi. Partnerships through SERVE include: The Rural Teacher Network; Mississippi Delta Consortium; Delta Project; Field Representative Program; and, the Rural Systemic Initiative. Through its work in Mississippi the past 12 months, SERVE has provided services to teachers, administrators, school boards, the State Department of Education, independent educational projects, and institutions of higher education.

The high points in the academic year were Honors Day and Commencement.

Honors Day is a longstanding tradition where recognition is given to outstanding student achievements. The "Jack Gunn Award," named in honor of the former academic dean, and considered to be the top academic honor, was presented to Robert (Rob) Patrick Armour from Southaven, Mississippi. The speaker for Honors Day was Dr. William E. Carroll, internationally acclaimed historian and author at Cornell College in Mount Vernon, Iowa.

The spring commencement graduating class of 794 was among the largest in the institution's history. The speaker at graduation was Ambassadca Jeanette W. Hyde, the

United States Ambassador to Barbados, Dominica, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and The Grenadines, and a Delta State alumnus. Dr. Grady E. Williams, III, Professor of Biology and Environmental Sciences, was the recipient of The S.E. Kossman Outstanding Teacher Award. Established by the Kossman family of Cleveland in memory of their father, the award enables the University to present a cash award for teaching excellence. The H.L. Nowell Outstanding Support Staff Award honors H.L. Nowell, who was employed by Delta State for over 40 years and was well known and respected for his work with students. This award was presented to Mr. Jimmy R. Williams, Manager of the University Bookstore.

Delta State's emphasis on economic development and the community was emphasized this past year through the efforts of the Center for Economic and Community Development. This Center obtained a seed-money planning grant of \$82,000 from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation of Battle Creek, Michigan, on December 1, 1994 "to initiate an intensive collaborative planning process for leadership, community and economic development in the Mississippi Delta." In collaboration with a 20-member Program Planning Committee and a number of collaborating partners, Center staff completed the planning process for an intensive and comprehensive five-year program. A proposal for the Delta Partners Initiative: "Helping Delta Communities Create Solutions in Leadership, Community and Economic Development" was submitted to the W.K. Kellogg Foundation and sought a grant of \$1,800,000 for a five-year program.

On December 21, 1994, President Bill Clinton selected the Mid-Delta

Empowerment Zone Alliance (MDEZA) as one of three Rural Empowerment Zones in the

English. The Director of Delta State's Center for Economic and Community Development

provided process and technical assistance to the MDEZA as plans were developed and implemented. Also, Dean Roy Moore was appointed to represent Delta State University on the Board of Commissioners, MDEZA.

As a part of the university's mission of outreach into the community, the Small Business Development Center (SBDC) counsels with current and prospective small business owners to improve and foster their success throughout the Mississippi Delta area. During the past year, the SBDC has given special attention to developing small businesses in rural areas of the Delta. In its efforts the center worked with over 200 clients. Almost 1000 hours of counseling produced 62 new or retained jobs with over \$1.6 million of actual investment into the area. During this period, the SBDC conducted 21 workshops across the Delta on a variety of topics with 412 people in attendance. To enhance its outreach efforts, training events were held in small communities such as Lambert, Merigold, Ruleville, and Shaw. In addition, a special emphasis, "Minority Small Business Week", was held in Mound Bayou with multiple workshops, seminars, dinners and tours of businesses.

Intercollegiate athletes had a successful year. The men's swimming coach was named Men's Coach of the Year in the new South Intercollegiate Swim League. The women's basketball team earned the Gulf South Conference title. Both the baseball team and women's tennis team received bids to their respective NCAA regional tournaments. The 1994 swimming and diving media guide was voted second in the nation by an independent judging staff for competition conducted by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). The 1994 and 1995 baseball media guides were voted 5th and 10th in the nation respectively, while the 1994 baseball postseason media guide

was rated 6th in the nation.

Campus facilities and grounds have undergone rigorous repair and renovation, as a result of the ice storm of 1994. Tree replacement and landscaping repair have returned the campus to its original form. Various buildings have been repaired and the James W. Broom building is scheduled for renovation starting in the Fall 1995 semester. Plans are now set to move forward with the \$4.5 million project to improve DSU's Roberts Library. The library will double its technological capacity and offer more computer access to students and faculty members for research purposes. The Performing Arts Center is complete, and the grand opening will take place on September 16, 1995. A Pulitzer Prizewinning composer, a Tony Award-winning musical, an international ballet troupe, and state and local musical talents comprise the schedule for the Grand Opening Series.

Marvin Hamlisch, a performer and the composer of over 40 motion picture scores, will open the series.

The wage and salary compensation scale was moved upward nine percent thus enabling the University to move closer to a competitive position in the market and affording University employees an average of 10 to 14 percent increases in their wages.

The Alumni Association and Foundation began the largest fund-raising effort on behalf of the entire university. The Foundation Board voted to initiate a \$5 million capital campaign to provide support in the following areas: (A) \$2 million programming endowment for the Performing Arts Center; (B) \$2 million endowment for Excellence in Sciences Program; and (C) \$1 million for the Enrichment Fund, which supports faculty development.

The 1994-95 year was very productive for Delta State in academic arenas and

throughout the campus. An increase in financial support from the state legislature has enabled Delta State to offer new programs, increase employee salaries to be more competitive with peer institutions, construct needed facilities, and make necessary repairs to the campus. Delta State is optimistic about the 1995-96 year as new programs will be implemented and new facilities erected. Delta State University continues its commitment to providing students with the knowledge necessary to become productive members of the workforce and society. This effort begins with Delta State's alliance with area schools and continues throughout a student's career, whether through assisting the student find employment or maintaining alumni relations. With the continued support of students, employees, alumni, friends, and the state legislature, Delta State University will continue to serve as the cultural and educational center of the region.

UNIVERSITY CHARACTERISTICS

Location: Delta State University is located in Cleveland, Mississippi, in the heart of the Mississippi Delta. The campus consists of 274.16 acres of land within or adjoining the western corporate limits. Cleveland is considered a rural city with a population of 15,384, and is situated in Bolivar County, which has a population of 41,875. The nearest urban city is 110 miles north in Memphis, TN. The nearest international airport is also located in Memphis. Regional airport facilities are located in Greenville, MS which is 40 miles southwest of Cleveland, and the nearest municipal airport is located within Cleveland's city limits.

History: Delta State University was created as Delta State Teachers College on April 9, 1924. The institution opened for its first regular session on September 15, 1925. The growth and expanding function of the institution were evidenced by its name change in 1955 to Delta State College. In 1969, Delta State was authorized to reorganize its academic structure into four schools within the institution. The School of Arts and Sciences and the School of Business were activated in 1969, while a School of Education and a School of Graduate Studies were implemented in 1970. On March 15, 1974, the institution was officially designated Delta State University. The first president of Delta State was Mr. James Wesley Broom. He was succeeded by Dr. W. M. Kethley, who served as president from 1926 to 1956. Dr. James Milton Ewing became the third president on September 1, 1956, and he served until his retirement on July 31, 1971. Dr. Ewing was succeeded by Dr. Aubrey Lucas, who served from August 1, 1971, until June 30, 1975. On July 1, 1975, Dr. Forest Kent Wyatt became the fifth and present president of Delta State University.

Academic Year: The University operates on the semester system with the fall semester beginning in late August and ending before Christmas. The spring semester begins in January and ends in May. There are two five-week summer sessions.

Enrollment: The total on-campus enrollment for Fall 1994 was 3,775. The total off-campus enrollment for Fall 1994 was 142: 58 in Greenville, 84 in other locations. Students came from 29 states and 9 foreign countries.

<u>Student Fees:</u> Tuition and fees for Mississippi residents are \$1,147 and for non-residents \$2,444 per semester. Dorm student's fees are \$1,090 per semester.

Housing: The University has 15 residence halls with a capacity of 1681. There are 6 national fraternities and 6 national sororities. Approximatley 17% of the undergraduate men are members of a fraternity and 19% of the women are members of a sorority.

Athletics: The University is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) at the division II level.

Accreditation: Delta State University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award bachelors, masters, specialists and doctoral degrees.

<u>Degrees</u>: The University offers 11 bachelor's degrees, 8 Master's degrees, 1 Specialist degree and 1 Doctoral degree. In May 1995 DSU awarded 641 bachelor's degrees, 133 master's, 6 specialist's, and 10 doctoral.

Faculty: DSU employed 269 faculty in the Fall 1994 of which 177 were full-time and 92 part-time. 46% held Doctoral degrees.

<u>Library</u>: The W.B. Roberts library collections consist of 208,855 bound volumes, 717,867 Microforms, 101,741 U.S. Government Documents, and 1,460 subscriptions.

<u>Fine Arts:</u> The Fielding Wright Art Center houses the art department and contains three galleries for hanging exhibitions. The Holcomb-Norwood addition to the art center was opened in Fall 1994 and the Performing Arts building was completed in Spring 1995.


DELTA STATE UNIVERSITYON-CAMPUS HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT FALL 1985-1994




DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY DISTRIBUTION OF EMPLOYEES * FALL 1994



DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY TUITION AND FEES* 1985-1994






TOTAL EDUCATION AND GENERAL EXPENDITURES



1994-95 FUNDS REVENUES BY SOURCE


