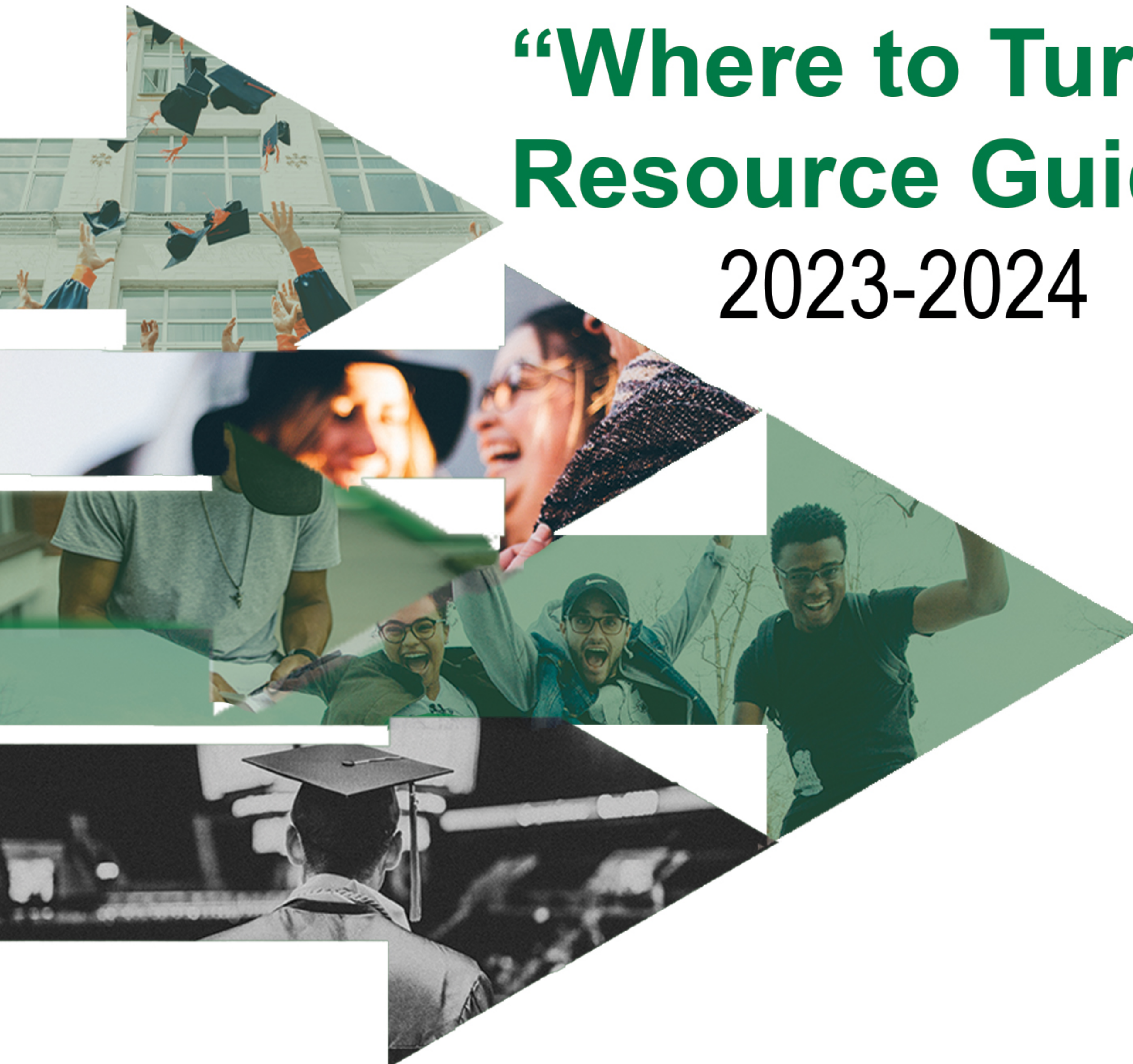

FINANCIAL AID

WHO:

The Office of Financial Aid is committed to assisting students like you in achieving your educational goals by helping you find resources available to pay for college. The Office processes federal, state, and institutional funds.

WHAT:

To determine your eligibility for federal financial aid (Pell Grant, Federal Student Loans, and Federal Work Study), you must submit a FAFSA application. To do so, please visit, www.studentaid.gov. Additionally, all scholarship recipients—if eligible to file— must have a completed FAFSA on file to disburse the scholarship(s).

You may be eligible for:

- **Pell Grant:**

Pell Grant is a need-based aid, and amounts are determined by the calculated Estimated Family Contribution (EFC). Award amounts are based on being full-time.

- **Federal Student Loans:**

Federal student loans are offered to undergraduates and parents of dependent undergraduate students. These loans tend to have a low interest rate. Award amounts are based on a student’s classification level (i.e., freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior) and the cost-of-attendance. These loans do not need to be repaid until six months after graduation. In other cases where students drop below six hours in a semester, they will be required to start repayment sooner.

- **Federal Work Study:**

The Federal Work Study program allows students to have an opportunity to work part-time on-campus or with specific off-site approved programs. The student’s work schedule is based on their class schedule, so it allows flexibility for hours being worked. Each student is approved for a specified award amount, and each month the student will receive a paycheck for the hours worked.

- **Other Financial Aid:**

Any additional aid can be used to off-set a student’s educational expenses. Other aid received must not exceed the student’s cost of attendance minus all other estimated financial aid being received. Funds that exceed a student’s charges shall be refunded.

- o **State Aid:**

Mississippi residents can apply for state aid with the Office of State Financial Aid at www.msfinancialaid.org. Programs vary based on need-based, ACT scores, majors, and other specific criteria. Be sure to review the deadlines, as some of the programs have earlier application deadlines.

- o **Scholarships:**

Academic scholarships for incoming students are awarded through the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. Departments have foundation scholarships that are awarded based on specified criteria. To view scholarship opportunities, visit the Okra Scholarship Management System (OSMS) at www.deltastate.academicworks.com/opportunities.

- o **Alternative Loans:**

Students who do not qualify for federal financial aid— or those who need additional assistance— can apply for an alternative loan. These loans are credit-based, so the student may need a co-signer. Repayment and interest rates vary from those of the federal student loans. Students are free to select a lender.

Things to Note:

- **myDSU portal will contain the most up-to-date information regarding your financial aid, as all awards will be posted on your financial aid account. Any outstanding documents will be posted within the system as well.**
- **Ensure you monitor your Okramail account, as this is the official form of communication from the University.**
- **Check out Okrabytes daily for any notices about outside scholarships, FAFSA assistance, and other pertinent information.**

HOUSING & RESIDENCE LIFE

Benefits of living on campus includes:

Residency Policy

- The University has a residency policy – full-time students who are under 21 years of age and have earned less than 60 college semester hours are required to live on campus for two academic years (4 semesters).

FAQ

- Can I request a single room (AKA private room)?**
- You may request a single room by sending an email to housing@deltastate.edu with your request.
 - Single rooms are available on a first come, first serve basis as space allows. Single rooms do cost more than a room with a roommate.

- Can I change my meal plan?**
- Yes! Submit a meal plan change request to housing@deltastate.edu by close of the day on the first Friday of each semester.
 - A layout of the various plans is shown on the Student Business Services page, under “Tuition and Fees.”
 - Freshmen are automatically enrolled in the All-Access Plan.

- How can I change rooms?**
- All students have until 5 p.m. on the first day of class to claim their assigned spaces. At 8 a.m. on the second day of class, students can go to the Housing Office (Union 202A) and make the request to change their room assignment.
 - Don't have a roommate? Want one? Come to the Housing Office (Union 202A) and request a roommate. We will help YOU find a roommate.
 - Be patient and persistent! Please don't be unhappy and never tell us – we can only help when we know!

- What if I need something while in my room or hall?**
- Each residence hall has Hall Staff there to help you with any issue in your room or hall.
 - All hall staff are trained to help assist in any situation that may occur in the halls. Situations may include but are not limited to – advice sharing for pre-registration, what to do if you need help in a class, where to get involved, room repairs, noise complaints, roommate issues, etc.

ADA SERVICES

The mission of Delta State University's Disability Services is to provide reasonable accommodations to ensure that students with disabilities are afforded equal educational opportunities.

HOW TO REQUEST ACCOMMODATIONS

- STEP 1.** Become admitted to the University.
- STEP 2.** Students should self-identify as a student with a qualified disability. You can do so by completing the accommodation interest form, sending an email to ada@deltastate.edu, or call at 662-846-4690.
- STEP 3.** Complete the Accommodation Interest Form using the link provided, to obtain the disability services accommodation packet.
- STEP 4.** Submit documentation that supports your diagnosis and current need for accommodations. The documentation should come from a professional who is qualified to render the diagnosis such as a psychometrist, psychologist, and/or medical doctor Please note: This list is just an example and is not limited to other qualified professionals. Documentation should be current-no more than 3-5 years old.
- STEP 5.** Schedule a meeting with the ADA coordinator to discuss your request, etc. To schedule an appointment contact ada@deltastate.edu or ldailey@deltastate.edu or call at 662-846-4690.
- STEP 6.** Each semester, you will request approved accommodations by submitting a copy of your new course schedule to the Office of Disability Services.
- STEP 7.** You will meet with your instructors to discuss your needs in each class.

OUR SERVICES INCLUDE DOCUMENT CONSULTATIONS, MOCK INTERVIEWS, AND PROFESSIONAL COACHING, INTERNSHIP/JOB SEARCH PLANNING, WORKSHOPS AND ON-CAMPUS INTERVIEWS, THE “OKRASUITS” CAREER CLOSET, THE “YOUSCIENCE” CAREER ASSESSMENT, THE CAREER AMBASSADORS’ STUDENT ORGANIZATION, AND MORE.
