What is Kids' College?

Kids' College is a series of fun and unique enrichment courses for kids in grades 1–6. This one week educational program, June 11-15, 2012 is taught by DSU faculty or qualified and experienced instructors.

When are classes?

All classes are on Monday – Friday. All programs are held on DSU campus, unless otherwise noted. Specific class dates/times are included on the registration form.

How do I register?

Complete the registration packet including all medical/release forms. Mail/drop off the completed packet and payment to Graduate & Continuing Studies, Kent Wyatt Hall 239, Cleveland, MS 38733, **by May 16, 2012**, to reserve your spot. Registration is on a <u>first-paid</u>, <u>first-enrolled basis</u>. Children will not be guaranteed a place in KC until the full registration fee is paid.

Will I receive a confirmation?

After the Registration deadline, you will receive a confirmation letter listing the classes that your child will be participating in during the week. This class list will be chosen from the choices that are marked on your application.

Disciplinary Information

Disruptive student's parents are notified. Continued disruption results in the student being asked not to return. The behavioral form must be signed and returned with registration.

Lunch

All day participants (3rd-6th) will eat lunch in DSU's cafeteria. (registration fee includes lunch)

Check-In Procedure!

On the first day of class please check in at the "Kids' College Registration Desk" in the north lobby of the James M. Ewing Hall. We will verify all paperwork and make sure you have a name tag with the appropriate classes listed.

Drop Off/Pickup Point

Drop Off/Pickup location will be at the north entrance of the James M. Ewing Hall. If you arrive early, wait with your child until an aide is available. Anyone arriving after the class start time will be responsible for getting their child to class. The KC aide will take students to their classes and return them at the end of their sessions. KC aides will wait with the students as they are picked up. A half day participant must be picked up from 12:00 to 12:30 p.m. each day and full day participant must be picked from 5:00 to 5:30 p.m. each day. Please adhere to the specified times. We cannot however assume responsibility for students beyond scheduled class and supervised times. Please do not request that your child meet you at a different location unless you have signed the "Parental Consent" form.



Behavior Policy:

At DSU's Kids' College, we aim for a positive, enjoyable learning experience for all of our students. Because we have our students for such a short time, we need to deal with inappropriate behavior quickly and consistently.

The following discipline rules need to be adhered to at all times...
