Provost's Updates	<p><u>Provost, Dr. Leslie Griffin, provided the following updates:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provost Griffin shared some key initiatives that have been discussed at recent CAO meetings and let everyone know to expect additional follow-up communication to come as updates are available. • She has organized a group led by Wayne Francis, AI Strategist from Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, to evaluate tools that support faculty in identifying and addressing AI use. The group will also develop guidance language for inclusion in course syllabi. 		Leslie Griffin

Faculty Senate	<p>Faculty Senate President, Peter Dean, provided the following update:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Peter Dean reported that the Faculty Senate would have an executive council meeting today. Peter Dean and Dr. Jon Westfall are participating in a task force formed by the Faculty Senate Association of Mississippi to study faculty pay. This began with a focus on adjunct faculty pay but has expanded to all faculty groups. Peter shared that the next Academic Council meeting will be his last as Dr. Jon Westfall will take over as Faculty Senate President. 		Peter Dean

Curriculum/Course Actions	<p><u>Curriculum Action: General Education Catalog Entry (Second Reading)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Dr. Jeffrey Leffler presented revisions to the General Education Catalog Entry based on feedback from the first reading. These revisions include grouping philosophy with the history courses in the humanities and artistic expression category and adding the word “or” between the microeconomics and macroeconomics courses. In discussion, Drs. Bingham, Childs, and Van Namen each expressed concerns regarding the wording of some of the competencies and the wording for the choice between history and literature courses in the humanities section be made more clear that the student could choose any combination of history and literature courses as long as they had two courses in one or both of those areas beyond the required artistic expression course. Proposed actions include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Approval of red-lined changes to the undergraduate catalog pending the revision of the wording of the identified competencies and a more clear statement that students may choose any combination of courses in the history and literature sections to satisfy two of the three courses required in the humanities category. 	<p><u>Curriculum Action: Remedial/Intermediate Task Force</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. Jeffrey Leffler shared a proposal from the Remedial/Intermediate Task Force. • Proposed actions include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Implement multiple-measures placement model using ACT/Accuplacer criteria: English ≤ 16 or < 255; Math ≤ 17 or < 247 or ACT 15+ with approved transitional math (≥ 80); Reading < 16 or < 255 ○ Replace remedial courses with credit-bearing co-requisite pathways ○ Launch ENG 101 + ENG 104 co-requisite model ○ Cap sections and embed diagnostic screening with targeted support ○ Default eligible students to MAT 103 or MAT 115 pathways ○ Add 1-credit math support co-requisite ○ Implement yearlong College Algebra sequence for underprepared students with majors requiring College Algebra ○ Develop internal math placement diagnostic ○ Create CRD 199 credit-bearing disciplinary literacy course ○ Develop yearlong, cohort-based First-Year Seminar (FYS) ○ Create second 8-week personal development course for at-risk students <p>A motion was made by Dr. Jeffrey Leffler to approve the action pending creation of the required new course and was seconded by Dr. Vicki Bingham. 	<p><u>Policy Action: Graduate Dismissal (Second Reading)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. Jeffrey Leffler shared a proposed revision to the Graduate Catalog to change the policy to allow a pathway for students to be readmitted after dismissal from a graduate program. The new policy allows a student to be considered for readmission after a three-year period has passed and the student successfully completes a minimum of six hours of graduate study as a non-degree seeking student with a minimum grade of “B.” • Proposed actions include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Red-lined changes to the Graduate Catalog to reflect the new pathway to readmission. <p>A motion was made by Dr. Jeffrey Leffler to approve the action and was seconded by Dr. Vicki Bingham. 	<p><u>Policy Action: Instructional Resources (First Reading)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. Jeffrey Leffler shared a proposed revision to the Instructional Resources policy. • Proposed actions include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Red-lined changes to the policy to reflect the current procedures and practices. • Discussion included needing more time to determine how the policy should appropriately reflect accessibility requirements and to include definitions for all concepts presented in the policy statement. Discussion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Canvas syllabus assignment template (Student Learning): Kristen Land shared a proposal to create a syllabus assignment in the Canvas template for all courses to verify meaningful week-one student participation. The proposal includes a pilot in Summer with full Fall rollout; Kristen to coordinate with Heather and Kelly and share with deans for implementation input • Expanded course descriptions (Student Government Association): Dr. Griffin presented a request from the Student Government Association to enhance Banner course descriptions to better communicate course activities and outcomes; to be explored with OIT • Mid-term evaluations: Dr. Griffin also shared that a SGA resolution that had been previously presented was referred to Faculty Senate which included concerns about the feasibility of the proposal as a fixed policy suggesting a more flexible format; Dr. Griffin requested a working group to study its potential use as a formative assessment tool for continuous course improvement.
