There is a definite need for a Black counselor here at Delta State. We demand that one such counselor be hired by this institution for the needs of Black students for the coming semester.

- II. Demand that Delta State hire at least two Black instructors to teach Black Histroy courses by fall semester 1969. These instructors must be interviewed by a committee composed of faculty members and Black students; students on this committee must be approved by Black students.
- III. Demand the terms, "nigger", "Negro", "nigra", and "colored", be deleted by instructors and the word "Black" be used instead.
- IV. Demand that a fairer grading system be instituted by instructors toward Black students and that the administration set up an inquiry committee to see that students are treated fairly by teachers. These people should be interviewed by the Black students.

STUDENT DEMANDS

- V. Demand that one Black student be placed on each studentfaculty committee. These students must be approved by The Black Student Movement.
- VI. Demand that Black students, in asking for rooms on campus, be placed not because of race but on first come first serve basis.
- 'VII. Demand that more scholarships be offered to Black students both academic and athletic.
- /III. Demand more social functions, which are Black orientated, be brought to Delta State College.
- IX. Demand that a section of books, chosen by The Black Student Movement, be placed in the Delta State library for the first semester of the academic year, 1969-1970.
- X. Demand that a Black male and female student be appointed or elected to the Student Government Association to serve as Senators. These constestants must be chosen by The Black Student Movement.

by those who lived it. Delta State University, in Cleveland, Mississippi, was segregated from 1925 to 1965. The school enrolled its first Black students in 1966. These first students struggled for recognition, for inclusion, and for fair treatment. By the Spring of 1969, as tensions rose, Delta State's Black students organized a series of actions and protests. These actions culminated in the quickly-escalating events of Monday, March 10, 1969. In VOICES FROM THE SIT-IN, the forgotten history of this moment is revealed. We meet some of the original students involved and relive the tense experience of a significant moment in the Civil Rights movement, exploring history almost unknown to students today. VOICES FROM THE SIT-IN features protesters Maggie Daily Crawford, Mary Carter, Talmadge Davis, and Muriel McCraney Lucas; 1969 student government association president James W. Powers; Delta State professors Georgene Clark and Dr. Charles Westmoreland; and current student Sykina Butts, who has been recording an oral history of the participants' stories. Filmed by current Delta State students, this 27-minute documentary brings to life an important story through lived
