Who can Apply?

What is Expected?

Recipients will be expected to:

- → Engage in real-world learning opportunities that support the regional mission of the scholarship program,
- → Work 20 hours per week,
- Produce regular and final project reports, and
- → Maintain a graduate GPA of 3.25

Application Requirements

- 1 DSU Graduate School Application
- 2 Official undergraduate transcript
- 3 Cover letter outlining the applicant's potential for impacting the MS Delta
- 4 Two Letters of Reference
- A 500- plus word essay describing the candidtate's commitment to the Delta and discussing the degree path and career plan as they relate to community and economic development

B.F. Smith Scholars Fellowship

The B.F.Smith Scholars Fellowship provides funding for qualified entering graduate students. The highly competitive graduate assistantship (\$3,000 plus tuition per semester for up to 3 semesters) is awarded to a limited number of students with a proven record of undergraduate achievement. The successful applicant will demonstrate a commitment to the Delta region in pursuit of a degree related to community and economic development.
